- 5. [Consider FY 2022-23 Administrative Budget](#) Katzenstein

An administrative budget is prepared each year as part of the annual MSRC budget. The MSRC-TAC Administrative Subcommittee has reviewed the proposed administrative budget and recommends approval.

- 6. **Consider 40-Month Term Extension by City of Long Beach, Contract #ML16017 (Purchase 50 Medium- and 17 Heavy-Duty Natural Gas Vehicles and Install CNG Station)** **Ravenstein**

After previously having been granted an extension of 29 months, the City requests an additional 40-month term extension. A number of factors have delayed acquisition of the final heavy-duty unit, including other demands on City staff in the early months of the pandemic, lack of responses when the truck was advertised for bid, and bids far in excess of original estimated cost. The City re-wrote the bid specification to lower the cost and they are now prepared to proceed.

- 7. **Consider Four-Month Term Extension by City of Colton, Contract #ML18020 (Purchase One Medium- and One Heavy-Duty Zero Emission Vehicle)** **Ravenstein**

After previously having been granted an extension of 32 months, the City requests an additional 4-month term extension due to delays in receiving the paperwork so payment could be processed and the vehicle could be registered.

- 8. **Consider Modified Statement of Work and 51-Month Term Extension by Irvine Ranch Water District (IRWD), Contract #MS18029 (Install New Limited Access CNG Station and Train Technicians)** **Ravenstein**

IRWD has determined that their needs would be better served by a fast-fill only fueling approach. Therefore, IRWD requests to eliminate the 12 time-fill hoses specified in the contract, and to install two 262 standard cubic feet/minute (scfm) compressors instead of installing two 90 scfm compressors. CNG storage would be increased from four vessels with 1,710 scf capacity each to nine 11,550 scf vessels. IRWD indicates that the project has been delayed due to numerous staff changes, the proposed change in the design and scope of the project, and the proposed location of the station on IRWD's property. The COVID-19 pandemic also impacted progress during the later portion of this period. Therefore, IRWD requests a 51-month term extension.

- 9. **Consider Four-Month Term Extension by Universal Waste Systems (UWS), Contract #MS18122 (Install New Limited Access CNG Station)** **Ravenstein**

After previously having been granted extensions of a total length of 3 years, UWS requests an additional 4-month term extension due to delays in obtaining the gas line hook up from Southern California Gas Company.

- 10. **Consider Reduced Contract Value and Reallocation of Costs by Los Angeles County Metropolitan Transportation Authority (Metro), Contract #MS21004 (Clean Fuel Bus Service to Dodger Stadium)** **Ravenstein**

Metro indicates that their promotion and outreach expenses are not anticipated to qualify as direct costs as defined by Contract #MS21004. In order to meet co-funding requirements, Metro requests to modify the types of expenses to be considered as co-funding, so that portions of the service operation, traffic control, and security costs would be included as co-funding. The total amount to be reimbursed by the MSRC would be reduced from \$2,188,899 to \$814,822.

11. Consider Re-Opening Contract for Los Angeles County Metropolitan Transportation Authority (Metro), Contract #MS21001 (Clean Fuel Bus Service to Dodger Stadium)

Ravenstein

A total \$285,665 was reimbursed under Contract #MS21001, and the contract was closed after receiving confirmation from Metro that no further invoices would be submitted. The remaining balance was reverted to the AB 2766 Discretionary Fund. Metro has now requested that the contract be re-opened and funded with unallocated funding. Metro requests to modify the types of expenses to be considered as co-funding, so that portions of the service operation costs would be included as co-funding. If approved, the MSRC would need to appropriate \$328,088 to re-open the contract.

12. Consider Two-Year Term Extension by City of Fontana, Contract #ML16047 (Enhance Existing Class 1 Bikeway)

Ravenstein

After previously having been granted extensions of a total length of 3 years, the City requests MSRC review of an additional two-year term extension request which has been denied by the MSRC Contracts Administrator. The City indicates the project has been further delayed due to extensive coordination with other agencies having jurisdiction, as well as the need to go through the courts to acquire the necessary right of way from a property owner.

SUBJECT: Comply with AB 361 Requirements to Allow MSRC-TAC to Continue to Meet Remotely

SYNOPSIS: This action is to adopt the attached Resolution finding that the MSRC-TAC: 1) has reconsidered the circumstances of the state of emergency; and 2) state or local officials continue to impose or recommend measures to promote social distancing. See Cal. Gov't Code section 54953(e)(3).

RECOMMENDATION: Adopt the attached Resolution finding that the MSRC-TAC: 1) has reconsidered the circumstances of the state of emergency; and 2) state or local officials continue to impose or recommend measures to promote social distancing.

FINANCIAL IMPACTS: None

Background: Governor Newsom previously issued Executive Orders (EOs) N-29-20 and N-35-2 in March 2020, as a response to the public health crisis brought about by the COVID-19 pandemic. These EOs authorized local legislative bodies subject to the Ralph M. Brown Act to conduct meetings entirely via telephonic or other electronic means in lieu of requiring the physical presence of legislative members or members of the public. On June 11, 2021 the Governor issued EO N-08-21, which continued suspension of the Brown Act's teleconferencing requirements, without requiring that members of the public be given the right to access all teleconference locations, through September 30, 2021, in anticipation of the State's proposed re-opening.

Assembly Bill 361, signed into law by Governor Newsom on September 16, 2021, amends the Brown Act and will stay in effect from October 1, 2021 until January 1, 2024. In part, AB 361 amends subparagraph (e) of section 54953 of the California Government Code to state that local agencies may continue to use teleconferencing without complying with the teleconferencing requirements of the Brown Act in any of the following circumstances:

- A. When the legislative body holds a meeting during a proclaimed state of emergency and state or local officials have imposed or recommended measures to propose social distancing;
- B. When the legislative body holds a meeting during a proclaimed state of emergency for the purpose of determining, by majority vote, whether as a result of the emergency, meeting in person would present imminent risks to the health or safety of attendees; or
- C. When the legislative body holds a meeting during a proclaimed state of emergency and has already determined, by majority vote, pursuant to subparagraph (B), that, as a result of the emergency, meeting in person would present imminent risks to the health or safety of attendees.

In the event of an ongoing proclaimed state of emergency, or where state or local officials have imposed or recommended measures to promote social distancing, in order to continue to utilize the teleconferencing measures set forth above, a legislative body must, no later than 30 days after teleconferencing for the first time pursuant to Government Code section 54953(e)(1), and every 30 days thereafter, make the following findings by majority vote:

- A. The legislative body has reconsidered the circumstances of the state of emergency.
- B. Any of the following circumstances exist:
 - i. The state of emergency continues to directly impact the ability of the members to meet safely in person; or
 - ii. State or local officials continue to impose or recommend measures to promote social distancing.

See Cal. Gov't Code section 54953(e)(1). Governor Newsom first declared a statewide emergency resulting from the COVID-19 pandemic on March 4, 2020. Furthermore, although the State no longer requires physical distancing, the MSRC, MSRC-TAC and their subcommittee meetings are generally held at the South Coast AQMD headquarters located in Diamond Bar, California, which is a city in Los Angeles County and both South Coast AQMD and the Los Angeles County Department of Public Health have recommended social distancing measures. The MSRC had previously considered the state of emergency for its legislative bodies.

Recommendations: This action is to address the requirements of AB 361 to allow the MSRC-TAC to meet remotely. The recommended action is to adopt the attached Resolution finding that the MSRC-TAC: 1) has reconsidered the circumstances of the state of emergency; and 2) state or local officials continue to impose or recommend measures to promote social distancing. See Cal. Gov't Code section 54953(e)(3).

8 **COMMITTEE, FOR THE PERIOD OF JUNE 2, 2022 THROUGH JULY 2, 2022 PURSUANT TO**
9 **PROVISIONS OF THE BROWN ACT.**

10 **WHEREAS,** the Technical Advisory Committee to the Mobile Source Air Pollution Reduction
11 Review Committee (MSRC-TAC) is committed to preserving and nurturing public access and participation
12 in all meetings subject to the provisions of the Ralph M. Brown Act (Cal. Gov't Code §§ 54950 – 54963,
13 hereafter Brown Act); and

14 **WHEREAS,** pursuant to the provisions of the Brown Act, all meetings of the MSRC-TAC are
15 required to be open and public so that any member of the public may attend, participate, and watch the
16 MSRC-TAC conduct their business; and

17 **WHEREAS,** the Brown Act, Government Code section 54953(e), makes provisions for remote
18 teleconferencing participation in meetings by members of a legislative body, without compliance with the
19 requirements of Government Code section 54953(b)(3), subject to the existence of certain conditions; and

20 **WHEREAS,** a required condition is that a state of emergency has been declared by the Governor
21 pursuant to Government Code section 8625, proclaiming the existence of conditions of disaster or of
22 extreme peril to the safety of persons and property within the state caused by conditions as described in
23 Government Code section 8558; and

24 **WHEREAS,** on March 4, 2020 the Governor proclaimed a State of Emergency to exist in California
25 as a result of the threat of the novel coronavirus (COVID-19); and

26 **WHEREAS,** pursuant to Health & Safety Code section 44244, the MSRC and its MSRC-TAC are
27 to adopt or assist in the development of a work program that is to be submitted to the south coast district
28 board. The South Coast Air Quality Management District includes all of the County of Orange and portions
of the Counties of Los Angeles, Riverside, and San Bernardino as set forth in Health & Safety Code section
40410 and South Coast AQMD Rule 103; and

1 **WHEREAS**, the MSRC-TAC usually meets at the South Coast AQMD headquarters, which is
2 located in the County of Los Angeles; and

3 **WHEREAS**, it is further required that state or local officials have imposed or recommended
4 measures to promote social distancing, or, the legislative body meeting would present imminent risks to the
5 health and safety of attendees; and

6 **WHEREAS**, local and California public authorities still recommend measures promoting social
7 distancing and/or mask wearing indoors and in public gatherings as well as recommending compliance with
8 the latest advice issued by the Center for Disease Control (CDC) regarding same; and

9 **WHEREAS**, on March 14, 2022, the County of Los Angeles Department of Public Health issued
10 further guidance promoting such measures; and

11 **WHEREAS**, on June 23 and August 10, 2021, the South Coast AQMD issued further guidance
12 promoting such measures; and

13 **WHEREAS**, the spread of COVID-19 poses a continued risk to the health and safety of members
14 of the MSRC-TAC, support staff, as well as to any members of the general public who attend such meetings
15 in that unvaccinated or partially vaccinated persons are at high risk of contracting this variant and even fully
16 vaccinated persons can contract and potentially unknowingly spread COVID-19; and

17 **WHEREAS**, the MSRC-TAC does hereby find that they shall conduct their meetings without
18 compliance with paragraph (3) of subdivision (b) of Government Code section 54953, as authorized by
19 subdivision (e) of section 54953, and that such legislative bodies shall comply with the requirements to
20 provide the public with access to the meetings as prescribed in paragraph (2) of subdivision (e) of section
21 54953; and

22 **WHEREAS**, the MSRC-TAC will continue to ensure access to their meetings by making them
23 available telephonically and via virtual access for both members of the legislative bodies and the general
24 public; and

25 **WHEREAS**, notice of meetings along with information regarding all methods which may be used
26 for public participation in such meetings will continue to be posted at the South Coast AQMD's
27 headquarters, posted at any teleconference locations which are officially noticed on the agenda, posted on

2 clearly printed on any agendas produced for such meetings.

3 **NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED**, that the MSRC-TAC hereby finds that the highly
4 contagious nature of the Omicron and Delta Variants of COVID-19 poses an imminent risk to large numbers
5 of persons meeting indoors in a single location; and

6 **BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED**, that the MSRC-TAC hereby finds that the Governor of California
7 issued a Proclamation of Emergency on March 4, 2020; and

8 **BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED**, that the MSRC-TAC hereby finds that local officials continue to
9 impose or recommend measures to promote social distancing in the South Coast AQMD’s jurisdiction and
10 where the South Coast AQMD’s headquarters is located; and

11 **BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED**, that the MSRC-TAC authorizes and directs staff to take all
12 actions necessary to carry out the intent and purpose of this Resolution including, conducting open and
13 public meetings in accordance with Government Code section 54953(e) and other applicable provisions of

Agenda Item #4 – Consider 24-Month Term Extension by Long Beach Transit, Contract #MS16121 (\$600,000 – Repower 39 Buses and Purchase 1 New Bus with Near-Zero Engines)

Cynthia Ravenstein, MSRC Contracts Administrator, explained that the Scope Changes Subcommittee discussed this item and has recommended to approve the requested extension, with the condition that Long Beach Transit will need to check in and report back to the MSRC-TAC on a regular basis to assure that they are moving forward with the project and not waiting until the end of the period to update the MSRC.

ON MOTION BY MSRC-TAC MEMBER MINH LE AND SECONDED BY MSRC-TAC MEMBER DEREK WINTERS, THE MSRC-TAC UNANIMOUSLY VOTED TO RECOMMEND TO APPROVE FOR LONG BEACH TRANSIT, CONTRACT #MS16121, A 24-MONTH TERM EXTENSION, CONTINGENT ON THE PROVISION OF QUARTERLY STATUS REPORTS

ACTION: MSRC staff will include this contract modification on the next MSRC agenda for approval.

Agenda Item #5 – Consider Reduced Inland Empire Operational Requirement by 4 Gen Logistics, LLC, Contract #MS21013 (proposed) (\$7,000,000 – Deploy 40 Zero Emission Trucks)

Cynthia Ravenstein, MSRC Contracts Administrator, explained that this project is from 4 Gen Logistics to reduce the required percentage of trips in the Inland Empire from 90% to 70%. The Scope Changes Subcommittee is recommending that staff continue to negotiate further with the proposed contractor due to several issues involved. There is no strong urgency for an immediate decision.

ITEM WAS DEFERRED TO THE NEXT MEETING

Agenda Item #6– Consider \$6,751,000 Contingency List and 18-Month Term Extension by Southern California Association of Governments (SCAG), Contract #MS21005 (\$10,000,000 – Implement Last Mile Goods Movement Program)

MSRC-TAC Member Alternate Scott Strolecki from SCAG presented. He explained that at the November 18, 2021 MSRC meeting, the Committee unanimously approved a \$10 million project list. This included 26 projects that are moving forward to begin the implementation process.

Additionally, guidance was provided to work with MSRC staff and the Last Mile Subcommittee to revisit the Contingency List projects.

The parameters for the Last Mile Freight Program Phase One Contingency List include the amount of unallocated MSRC FYs 2018-21 funds—the available funding--being clarified to \$6.75 million. The Contingency List is being considered as a separate program from the initial \$10 million award. The Phase One Program Guidelines' overarching provisions are being maintained. This includes the investment funding maximum not exceeding 50% of the total; consistent with the available funding, this has been adjusted to \$3.4 million. The geographic funding minimum per county is set at 12.5% of the total; this has been adjusted accordingly to \$844,000 per county. The small business funding minimum is set at 30% of the total award; this has been adjusted to \$2 million. Scores from the October review panel determining project ranking have been retained.

The revised proposed Phase One Contingency List incorporates the recommendations made by the MSRC-TAC Last Mile Subcommittee meeting on December 14, 2021. As requested by the Subcommittee, SCAG staff followed up to confirm whether each company would be able to perform their respective project with a reduced award amount and or whether scope changes would be required. The agenda packet further explains the adjustments made from the Subcommittee's recommendation. The adjustments include removing the MHX project. MHX stated that they would not be able to participate, given the recommended funding amount at \$993,369. As a result, this amount was redistributed equally across the remaining top six projects, excluding Penske, as it was already recommended for full funding. As a result of these adjustments, three of the six companies are still able to maintain their original number of vehicles and charging infrastructure: Watt EV, Penske and GLI. Sysco, Pepsi and Zeem all reduced their scope, but each would be providing proportionally more vehicles and infrastructure per incentive dollar at their recommended award amounts in comparison to their original requests. All core parameters have been met when considering the six projects, this includes the following areas: no project exceeded the investment funding maximum amount of \$3.4 million; each county exceeded the threshold of \$844,000 for the geographic funding minimum; and the small business funding minimum threshold was exceeded as well. All of these results were calculated based on the project domicile locations within each county.

All the proposing companies have highlighted ongoing supply chain delays stemming from the COVID-19 pandemic. This has led to significant increased expectations for the procurement process, including actual submissions of the open orders for both near zero and zero emission vehicles and supporting infrastructure. The agenda packet provides further commentary received from multiple companies including expectations that vehicles would not be received until the first quarter of 2023 at the earliest for natural gas vehicles, as well as similar concerns expressed for battery electric vehicles and infrastructure to be received in the 2023 year. The expectation for the Last Mile Freight Program is to have a six-month operating period for data collection and performance reporting. The current contract end date for this requirement is June 30, 2023. For the vehicles procured after January 2023, this requirement would not be achievable. This topic was not discussed at the Subcommittee meeting as the information became clear during the requested diligence process and through SCAG's work on MOU completion. We felt it best to create transparency now for the TAC to discuss and consider, as it appears procurement delays are not a question of if but rather how long. This unfortunately is beyond SCAG's control. We feel an 18-month contract extension would provide a reasonable amount of time to meet these

contract requirements, with data reporting being an extremely important and valuable component for the final report.

With the modifications that have been made, we are seeking a recommendation from the TAC for the MSRC to approve the Last Mile Freight Program, Phase One Contingency List projects to be awarded \$6.75 million and additionally, due to current supply chain issues SCAG is requesting MSRC approval of an 18-month extension of Contract #MS21005.

MSRC-TAC Member Minh Le stated that he served on the Subcommittee and reviewed these projects. For a third of the amount of money that was originally asked for, we're going to get 60% of the deliverables, basically doubling the impact of the dollars. Though Mr. Le said that was great, he wanted to state that in the future we should try to stay within budgets that were previously approved. He stated that he understands that these were extenuating circumstances with reissuing of the call for proposals, but if there were \$10 million appropriated for this program or any program in the future, we should aim to spend \$10 million and not necessarily more than that.

MSRC-TAC Member Adriann Cardoso stated that she appreciated SCAG being proactive in terms of the delivery delays and addressing that upfront.

Public Comment:

Adrian Martinez, an attorney from Earth Justice, asked for clarification regarding the gas trucks and the delays. It was a little hard to understand what consultant applied for those trucks with these independent owner-operators and the information on supply chain delays and how that information is being gathered. With all the other projects and presentations, it was clear who was applying, but for this one, it was unclear who the consultant who applied for those 24 near-zero trucks was, and how the information on the supply chain delays was conveyed to SCAG. The other point is the issue on supply chain disruption, for all vehicles, but including natural gas vehicles. It's a topic that the public would like more information about, since it's kind of hard to understand how those are going to be moving forward. I'd encourage some more discussion at MSRC and potentially even more presentations from experts on this topic before the end of the first quarter, before natural gas truck manufacturers will be taking orders. It will be important moving forward as MSRC and other entities provide funding for these types of trucks.

Mr. Strelecki stated that with respect to the independent owner-operators they have been working through a consultant with them. For clarification, which was part of the presentation at the last November's meeting, this represented 23 companies with the substantial majority, 22 of those, being just one truck and one of them having five trucks. These are very small business independent owner-operators. We get this information from the consultant working independently with each one and we're just getting feedback on what they're seeing with respect to their orders. We are in the MOU process where each company has to complete an MOU and that's predicated on the requirement for data reporting, among other provisions and completing the project.

FYs 2021-24 WORK PROGRAM

Agenda Item #7 – Update on FYs 2021-24 Work Program Development Process

Ray Gorski, MSRC Technical Advisor updated the MSRC-TAC on the FYs 2021-24 Work Program Development Process. The actual Subcommittee meetings have not yet occurred, but he wanted to convey some information that staff have been compiling. Staff have been having meetings with stakeholders such as original equipment manufacturers (OEMs) who are looking forward to potential participation in the MSRC's upcoming Work Program. In the last meeting we requested participation for two Subcommittees which were approved by the TAC and the MSRC: the Goods Movement Subcommittee and an Innovative Transportation Subcommittee. The governor's proposed budget was released this week and it shows a substantial investment that will be made specifically in clean transportation zero emission vehicles. The MSRC has expressed their desire to leverage the MSRC's investment with state money to the extent feasible. Staff is going to be having additional follow-up discussions to better understand how this money will be deployed within the state programs such that the MSRC can forge potential partnerships with state agencies to move projects of mutual interest forward. Staff have been engaging partners, potential stakeholders, and technology OEMs over the last several weeks. We have received concept papers for some specific projects. In some cases, we've been asked to sign non-disclosure agreements, because some of the technology or at least business plans aren't yet ready for public dissemination. However, these conversations will be brought forward to the Subcommittees for their deliberation as we begin to meet.

There's a need to manage expectations as to when MSRC projects will be delivered. There will be delays, we know that the supply chain broke and we also know that it did not recover as was hoped back in summer and fall. We can point to some progress, but this fragility is going to continue for several months and the disruption is across the board. So as we begin our Subcommittee process, we'll be taking into account reasonable expectations of when, for example, technology can be delivered to the end user.

To address some of Mr. Martinez' comments under Item #6, we have regular discussions with OEMs that are manufacturing advanced technology vehicles, and they are telling us what their realistic schedules are. We also work closely with the South Coast AQMD on other projects, which are specific to natural gas vehicles, such as the Market Acceleration Program. That is a partnership between the South Coast AQMD, the MSRC, and Clean Energy. We have knowledge as to delays of at least on the order of 12 months for those natural gas vehicles to be delivered. We have had multiple meetings with the vehicle vendors, and they have told us what their expectations are for an entity which puts an order in today and when they should expect

their vehicles. The information which SCAG just presented in Item #6 relative to a minimum requirement of an additional 18 months is sound.

Public Comment:

Adrian Martinez with Earth Justice gave a recommendation as staff is engaging stakeholders, it'd be great to engage with the environmental community and the environmental justice community to talk about their priorities. A lot of times those groups are engaged in these incentive programs. They're the folks on the frontlines near the hubs where this transportation system is causing the most harm. They would have some input. He stated that he recognizes the delays are really hard, that they are seeing it across vehicle types, but he would still like to encourage engagement with groups like that, or other committees at AQMD or other entities to get prioritization of funding from MSRC.

Jack Symington with the Los Angeles CleanTech Incubator asked if the Subcommittee meetings are going to be open to the public.

Mr. Gorski answered by stating that the Subcommittee meetings will not be open to the public per se, however, the MSRC-TAC will be extremely forthcoming and transparent. The MSRC-TAC meetings are held in a public forum which will share the results of the Subcommittee meetings. Any member of the public is more than welcome to provide guidance or suggestions relative to programs, projects, processes, which could help influence the MSRCs work program development.

NO ACTION TAKEN

ACTION: No further action is required.

OTHER BUSINESS

MSRC-TAC MEMBER Minh Le stated his team is working on submitting an application to the Department of Commerce's Good Jobs challenge. This is a \$500 million federal grant program, with a maximum award of \$25 million. His team is putting together a \$25 million grant application to create Southern California Green Careers Accelerator to support job growth in our region or broader region beyond LA County itself. He would appreciate those letters of support to the federal government on his team's behalf.

He also mentioned the Infrastructure and Recovery Act that was passed last November will allocate approximately \$8 billion to create about four hydrogen hub demonstration regions around the country. Mr. Le stated he thinks hydrogen can play a very important role in our region and would align very well with the goals of the MSRC, the TAC and many agencies here; it's going to be a very competitive program. He welcomes collaboration to draw in that likely billion-plus dollars of federal and state investments into our region,

Responding to brief questions, Mr. Le stated that LA County will not be the lead for the hydrogen work project, though they will be involved. There's clear recognition that California needs to put forth a very strong proposal to win and it's going to take collaboration with important stakeholders, like the utilities, the ports and SoCal Gas. It's not going to be just one

organization.

On December 6, 2019, the SCAQMD Governing Board approved an award under the Major Event Center Transportation Program. This contract is executed.

On September 4, 2020, the SCAQMD Governing Board approved an award under the Last Mile component of the MSRC's Regional Goods Movement Program. This contract is executed.

On April 2, 2021, the SCAQMD Governing Board approved five awards under the Zero and Near-Zero Emission Cargo Handling Equipment at Warehouse, Distribution and Intermodal Facilities in Riverside and San Bernardino Counties Program and ten awards under the Zero and Near-Zero Emission Trucking to Warehouse, Distribution and Intermodal Facilities in Riverside and San Bernardino Counties Program. These contracts are under development, undergoing internal review, with the prospective contractor for signature, or executed.

On June 4, 2021, the SCAQMD Governing Board approved an award under the Major Event Center Transportation Program. This award has been declined.

SUBJECT: FY 2022-23 Administrative Budget

SYNOPSIS: As part of the annual MSRC budget, administrative costs are limited to not more than 6.25 percent of the annual MSRC portion of the AB 2766 revenues. Each year, an administrative budget is prepared. For FY 2022-23, the projected administrative costs are \$832,103 against a cap of \$1,018,750.

RECOMMENDATION(S): Review and approve the attached FY 2022-23 Administrative Budget, and forward it to the MSRC for review and approval.

WORK PROGRAM IMPACT: Seventy-five (75) percent of the technical advisor's contract, or an estimated amount of \$289,275, is chargeable to the FY 2021-24 Work Program. There are no other work program impacts.

BACKGROUND:

California Health & Safety Code, Section 44233, limits the administrative expenses for the MSRC to not more than 6.25 percent of its annual AB 2766 revenues. Each year, an administrative budget is prepared for review and approval by the MSRC.

DISCUSSION:

The proposed FY 2022-23 Administrative Budget is \$832,103 as shown in the attachment. The projected 6.25 percent administrative cap is \$1,018,750, leaving a margin of \$186,647. The following elements apply to these projections:

(1) Staff Salaries:

Costs are projected for three full-time staff positions (one Program Supervisor and two Contracts Assistants), and a part time position (Senior Administrative Assistant).

(2) Staff Administrative Support

South Coast AQMD charges MSRC for certain support functions provided to the MSRC. This includes legal, financial, and contractual support.

(3) Burdened Rates:

South Coast AQMD charges MSRC burdened rates for its staff positions and other administrative support personnel. The fully burdened hourly rate reflects the FY 2022-23 proposed overhead rates and the existing South Coast AQMD labor agreement resulting in an increase of \$2,559 in staffing costs.

(4) Miscellaneous Direct Costs:

These costs include: (1) 25 percent of the technical advisor's contract costs, in an estimated amount of \$48,213; (2) annual travel costs of \$2,500; (3) \$5,000 for conference related expenses and (4) miscellaneous expenses, such as printing, mailing, refreshments, etc., in the amount of \$48,500.

(5) Revenues:

Based on receipts for the AB 2766 program, the revenue projection has been revised to reflect the current trend in revenue collections.

In summary, the projected FY 2022-23 Administrative Budget reflects the best and most reasonable cost estimates that are currently available.

Project Title: Purchase 50 Medium-Duty and 17 Heavy-Duty Natural Gas Vehicles and Install CNG Station

MSRC Funding: \$1,445,400

Project Term: February 2, 2016 to January 4, 2026

Current Request: 40-month term extension

Previous Requests: Reduce number of vehicles, substitute vehicles, and 29-month term extension; Increase number of vehicles and substitute vehicles

Project Description: The City was originally awarded funding to purchase 48 medium-duty and 16 heavy-duty natural gas vehicles and install a CNG Station. Contract #ML16017 was executed to effectuate the award, subsequently modified to increase the number of vehicles to 50 medium-duty and 19 heavy-duty, then modified again to reduce the number of heavy-duty vehicles to 17. \$1,405,400 has been paid to date on this contract; the CNG station and 65 vehicles have been placed into service.

Previous Requests: The City indicated that due to changes in their vehicle replacement schedule, in addition to manufacturer production changes, the City wished to make several changes to the list of vehicles to be purchased. Additionally, the substitutions were not strictly one-for one. The contract called for the purchase of 48 medium-duty and 16 heavy-duty vehicles. The City now proposed to purchase 50 medium-duty and 19 heavy-duty vehicles, with no change to the overall funding amount. They professed their understanding that they would be accepting a lower per-vehicle incentive in some cases. All the proposed substitute vehicles met FYs 2014-16 Local Government Match Program requirements. The MSRC considered and approved the City's request.

Later, the City communicated their desire for further changes to the list of vehicles to be purchased. The requested changes would actually reduce the number of heavy-duty vehicles from 19 to 17, with no change to the contract amount. Normally, the MSRC would not consider a reduction in scope without a corresponding reduction in value. However, should the MSRC approve the City's request, the City would still be purchasing more vehicles than originally proposed, for the same amount of funding originally proposed. Thus it was deemed that the modification could be permissible at the MSRC's discretion. The City further requested a 29-month term extension to accommodate the changes in vehicle models and types. The MSRC considered and approved the City's requests.

Contract Request: The City now indicates that two vehicles remain to be placed into service. One medium-duty vehicle is expected to be complete within the next quarter. The final heavy-duty unit, a paint striper truck, has posed greater challenges. A number of factors have delayed acquisition of this truck, including other demands on City staff in the early months of the pandemic, lack of responses when the truck was advertised for bid, and bids far in excess of original estimated cost. The City re-wrote the bid specification to lower the cost and they are now prepared to proceed. They expect delivery by May 1, 2024. The City requests a 40-month term extension to allow for the required five-year operational period.

The City of Long Beach hereby requests an extension of the contract above to May 4, 2029. This is an extension of three years and four months from the previously approved extension to January 4, 2026.

At this time, 95.5% of the project has been completed. The slow-fill CNG station has been operational since April 2017. And 64 of the 67 medium- and heavy-duty CNG fueled trucks have been placed into service. The final heavy-duty unit, a paint striper truck, is expected to be constructed and delivered to the Fleet Services Bureau by May 1, 2024.

The primary reason for the delay in completing this contract stems from the onset of the COVID-19 viral outbreak in early 2020. For the following six months, the entire City of Long Beach (the City) Purchasing Division was devoted to providing products, services and support for the City to serve its residents and front-line staff. When the City was ready to advertise bids for fleet vehicles, many businesses were unable to respond to the bid opportunities, with reduced production staff, supply chain issues, and the need for price adjustments to compensate for lost revenue.

The bid for the paint striper truck was advertised three times. The first advertisement generated no bids. The second bid was advertised with the lowest bid coming in at more than \$300,000 over the estimated cost. After discussion with the user department, the bid specification was re-written to lower the cost. The extended time during this process, a full 18 months, allowed for further collection of replacement costs.

Should the contract extension fail to be approved by the MSRC, street lane lines, curb marking and directional signage operations will be severely impacted. The vehicle purchase will be further delayed until alternative funding is obtained.

Project Description: The MSRC awarded the City of Colton \$67,881 towards the purchase of one medium-duty and one heavy-duty ZEVs. Both vehicles have now been placed into service, and \$35,667 has been paid to date on this contract.

Previous Requests: The City indicated that they submitted a purchase order for an all-electric passenger van in November 2019. The project was placed on a waiting list for Hybrid and Zero-Emission Truck and Bus Voucher Initiative (HVIP) funding, but the City was unsuccessful. Once HVIP reopened, the funding levels were reduced. The City and their dealership were able to identify a solution involving acquisition of a low-mileage demonstration vehicle which had already received HVIP funding. MSRC staff deemed that the mileage was low enough to be acceptable for purposes of the contract. However, HVIP would not allow ownership to be transferred to the City until November 30, 2021. The City requested a 32-month contract term

extension to allow time to meet the Local Government Partnership Program's five-year operational requirement. The MSRC considered and approved the City's request.

Contract Request: The City now indicates that there were further delays in receiving the paperwork so payment could be processed and the vehicle could be registered, but the vehicle is now in service. The City requests a four-month term extension to allow for the required five-year operational period.

Project Description: IRWD was awarded \$185,000 under the MSRC's FYs 2016-18 Natural Gas Infrastructure Program to install a limited access CNG station (\$175,000) and train mechanics (\$10,000). Station design is being finalized based on the proposed updated scope. Nothing has been paid to date on this contract.

Contract Request: The original scope of IRWD's project as specified in Contract #MS18029 included the installation of 12 time-fill hoses, one fast-fill hose, two compressors of at least 90 scfm each, and four storage vessels with at least 1,710 scf capacity each. IRWD has since decided to increase its fuel storage capacity requirement throughout the service area to include three days of emergency fuel storage based on average daily CNG fuel consumption. They have determined that their fueling needs would be better served by a completely fast-fill approach. Consequently, IRWD proposes to install two 262 scfm compressors and nine 11,550 scf vessels. They would not install the 12 time-fill hoses. IRWD requests approval of this modified scope. The total project cost estimate has quadrupled, but there would be no change to the MSRC's contribution.

IRWD indicates that the project has been delayed due to numerous staff changes and the proposed change in the design and scope of the project. IRWD has also changed the proposed location of the station on their property from the parking lot to a hillside location, which will involve additional tasks including excavation, road modifications, and the construction of a retaining wall. The COVID-19 pandemic has also impacted progress during the later portion of this period. The station is now expected to be operational by January 2024. IRWD requests a 51-month contract term extension in order to fulfill the five-year operational requirement.

In January 2018 Irvine Ranch Water District (IRWD) applied for and received funding from the 2017 Natural Gas Infrastructure Program for the construction of a new limited access compressed natural gas (CNG) station. A funding agreement, contract MS18029, was executed in August 2018 which required construction of the project to be complete by October 2019. Due to a variety of factors discussed in further detail below, the scope and schedule of the project has changed. Please accept this letter as IRWD's formal request to extend contract MS18029.

Project Background:

IRWD operates one central Fleet Services Facility at IRWD's operations center, the Michelson Water Recycling Plant (MWRP), that maintains a fleet of approximately 300 vehicles ranging from passenger vehicles to heavy machinery. The Fleet Services Facility has a fuel island located in the parking lot area with both diesel and gasoline fuel dispensers. Of the approximately 300 vehicles, 11 are fueled by CNG, including jetter trucks, vactor trucks, hydraulic excavators, a tractor, and a boom crane. The tractor and boom crane vehicles are operated on an infrequent basis but the remaining CNG vehicles are operated on a regular basis. IRWD anticipates expanding its CNG vehicle fleet by 5 dump trucks and 3 boom crane vehicles in the future. Currently IRWD fuels its CNG vehicles at the City of Irvine's CNG fueling facility, and at the City of Santa Ana's CNG fueling facility when the former is not in operation.

The original scope of IRWD's CNG Fueling Facility project included the construction of 12 time-fill hoses, one fast-fill hose, and two compressors. IRWD has since decided to increase its fuel storage capacity requirement throughout the service area to include three days of emergency fuel storage based on average daily CNG fuel consumption. When issuing a request for proposals for the preliminary design of the project, IRWD included the storage requirement in the scope for design of the CNG Fueling Facility. Additionally, IRWD was in the process of expanding its diesel fuel storage from one day of storage to

three days of storage at all generators and fuel storage locations throughout IRWD. As a result, the preliminary design report for the CNG fueling facility included preliminary design for increasing the capacity of the MWRP diesel fuel storage to account for three days of emergency storage.

Project Completion Status:

A preliminary design report for the CNG fueling facility which included the criteria, fueling scenarios and layout options for the facility was completed in July 2020. The preliminary design report recommended a fast-fill only CNG fuel dispenser to meet IRWD’s CNG fueling needs. A design consultant was contracted in February 2021 for the design of the project. A Basis of Design Report was prepared in April 2021, which summarized the design criteria. Currently, the consultant is in the process of finalizing the plans and project manual.

The updated scope for the CNG Fueling Facility will include two compressors, each rated at 262 standard cubic feet per minute (SCFM); nine CNG storage vessels, each providing 11,550 standard cubic feet (SCF) at 4,500 psig storage capacity; one dual-hose fast fill dispenser. The CNG fueling facility was designed to fill the entire CNG vehicle fleet plus eight future fleet vehicles in a single day at 5-7 minutes per fill, with a 2 minute headway for a total time of 7-9 minutes per vehicle with one hose operating. During preliminary design, it was determined that a single fast-fill dispenser was sufficient to meet IRWD’s CNG fueling needs and therefore the 12 slow-fill dispensers originally included in the project scope were not necessary. Limited space at the Project site was also a contributing factor in eliminating the 12 slow-fill dispensers. Additionally, the facility location has changed from the parking area at MWRP, located north west from an existing fuel island to a hillside location at the east edge of MWRP. The new project location will require excavation, a new retaining wall, and other road modifications. The updated cost for the CNG Fueling Facility is estimated at \$4.2 million dollars. Towards the end of project construction, six IRWD employees will undergo technician training through the Natural Gas Vehicle Institute’s Vehicle and CNG Fueling Station Training Program.

New Project Schedule:

As design is being completed, the project is expected to go out for bid next month. Below is an updated project schedule.

Reasons for Delay:

The Project has been delayed past the original completion date specified in contract MS18029 for a variety of unforeseen reasons. There have been numerous staff changes over the past few years,

including the project manager for the CNG Fueling Facility. Following the transition between project managers, the design and scope of the project also changed. IRWD determined that the District needed to increase its fuel storage requirement to three days of emergency fuel storage. When sourcing for preliminary design services, this fuel storage requirement was included in the project scope which changed with the initial Preliminary Design Report and added new elements to the project. In addition to these changes, the proposed location of the CNG Fueling Facility relocated from the MWRP parking lot to a hillside location at the eastern border of MWRP. The relocation of the Project will involve additional tasks including excavation, road modifications, and the construction of a retaining wall. Unfortunately, during this period the COVID-19 pandemic also began and resulted in unexpected delays to the Project.

Length of Extension Requested:

IRWD is anticipating awarding the project for construction in July 2022. The Project is planned to take eighteen months to construct due to equipment lead times and phases required to construct the project. Construction of the CNG Fueling Facility will be completed by January 2024. IRWD is requesting an extension to January 2029, four years and three months from the original contract termination date. A contract extension to January 2029 will allow for the project to finish construction and be fully operational for five years.

Consequences of Denial:

The CNG Fueling Facility is an important infrastructure project for IRWD. Without the Project, IRWD's CNG vehicles will have to continue to fuel offsite at the City of Irvine's CNG fueling facility or the Santa Ana CNG fueling facility. Constructing an on-site CNG fueling facility would alleviate the need for staff to travel offsite and result in considerable time savings for staff. While IRWD has not started construction on the Project yet, it has begun procuring permits required for the Project and has completed design. To date, IRWD has incurred approximately \$1.2 million in costs relating to permitting, design, and staff time.

IRWD is appreciative of the MSRC for initially awarding the Project under the Natural Gas Infrastructure Program and hopes to continue to work with MSRC staff. Thank you for your consideration in reviewing this request to extend contract MS18029.

Contractor: Universal Waste Systems

Project Title: Install Limited Access CNG Station

MSRC Funding: \$200,000

Contract Term: February 1, 2019 to March 31, 2027

Current Request: Four-month term extension

Previous Requests: Two-year term extension; one-year term extension

Project Description: UWS was awarded \$200,000 under the MSRC's FYs 2016-18 Natural Gas Infrastructure Program to install a limited access CNG station. UWS has installed the station equipment and the gas line has now been connected, but the station is not yet commissioned. Nothing has been paid to date on this contract.

Previous Requests: UWS indicated that construction was delayed, primarily due to delays associated with Southern California Gas assuring adequate flow to the site. UWS requested a one-year term extension. This modification was processed administratively.

Later, UWS indicated that the COVID-19 pandemic had impacted their ability to complete permitting with the City of South Gate, and the process to get power delivered by Southern California Edison was taking longer than anticipated. They anticipated having the electrical signed off within the next 30 days and would begin the construction for power delivery to the site. They requested, and the MSRC approved, a two-year term extension.

Contract Request: UWS states that the station is now fully installed. There was a substantial delay in getting the gas line connected. While they indicate that they initiated their request with Southern California Gas right after the first of the year, Southern California Gas needed to perform some enhancements to accommodate UWS' request. This has now been completed. MSRC staff have confirmed with UWS that they have also received final approval from the City of South Gate. The station is now expected to be operational by July 31, 2022. UWS requests a four-month contract term extension in order to fulfill the five-year operational requirement.

Please accept this letter as our request for a time extension related to Contract MS18122A signed on February 1, 2019 and your email of Thursday April 28, 2022.

We would like to request that the installation portion of the contact previously set for March 31, 2022 be extended to July 31, 2022 due to the following circumstances. The Compressed Natural Gas (CNG) fueling station for Universal Waste Systems (UWS) is fully installed and we are awaiting the following.

- The delay in commission of the fueling station has been caused by Southern California Gas and its schedule to hook up the station to the gas line. This has now been completed as of the preparation of this letter.
- We have contacted the City of South Gate to request that the fueling station receive its final inspection and permit sign off. This should have by the 15th of May 2022.
- UWS is in the process of securing ANGI Energy Systems to perform the commissioning of the station in late May or early June of 2022 in order to have the station operational by July 31, 2022.
- The major cause of the delay was the gas hook up coordinated by So Cal Gas as well as we needed to wait to have the City sign the permit for the completion of project until this occurred.
- If the MSRC does not grant the extension, UWS would be harmed as they have included the Grant amount in their capital budget which would require them to find alternative financing to complete the project.

SYNOPSIS: Metro indicates that their promotion and outreach expenses are not anticipated to qualify as direct costs as defined by Contract #MS21004. In order to meet co-funding requirements, Metro requests to modify the types of expenses to be considered as co-funding, so that portions of the service operation, traffic control, and security costs would be included as co-funding. The total amount to be reimbursed by the MSRC would be reduced from \$2,188,899 to \$814,822, as part of the FYs 2018-21 Major Event Center Transportation Program.

FINANCIAL IMPACT: If the MSRC approves Metro’s request, the value of Contract #MS21004 would be reduced to \$814,822. \$1,374,077 would revert to the AB 2766 Discretionary Fund. Rather than promotion and outreach expenses, administration, service operation, traffic control, security, planning and reporting expenses would be used as co-funding.

Current Request: Reduced value and reallocation of costs

Previous Requests: Reallocate funding to future seasons

Project Description: The MSRC awarded Metro \$2,188,899 under the FYs 2018-21 Major Event Center Transportation Program to implement a clean fuel transit service to Dodger

Stadium for 2020 and 2021. This was subsequently changed to 2021 and 2022. Nothing has been paid to date on this contract.

Previous Request: Before the contract to effectuate the award was executed, the COVID-19 pandemic resulted in a freeze of major league baseball games. Metro requested the MSRC to consider 1) reallocation of the Dodger Stadium Express funding to future baseball seasons and 2) modification of the Major Event Center Program. In August 2020, the MSRC considered Metro's request and modified the Program Announcement's deadline for events to December 31, 2022. The MSRC also approved reallocating the funds awarded to Metro to the 2021 and 2022 baseball seasons.

Contract Request: For projects implemented between January 1, 2021 and December 31, 2022, the 2019-2021 edition of the Major Event Center Transportation Program requires that co-funding must be greater than or equal to 60% of the total project cost. As specified in Metro's original proposal, Contract #MS21004 places the majority of co-funding in the promotion and outreach expense category. Also as defined by the Program, Contract #MS21004 specifies that promotion and outreach expenses must be direct costs in order to qualify.

Metro now indicates that their promotion and outreach expenses are not anticipated to qualify as direct costs as defined by Contract #MS21004. In order to meet co-funding requirements, Metro requests to modify the types of expenses to be considered as co-funding, so that portions of the service operation, traffic control, and security costs would be included as co-funding. The total amount to be reimbursed by the MSRC would be reduced from \$2,188,899 to \$814,822. The specific breakdown is included in Metro's letter.

The Program allows these expense types to be counted as co-funding, and they would have been approved if originally proposed. If the MSRC approves Metro's request, \$1,374,077 would revert to the AB 2766 Discretionary Fund.

SUBJECT: Consider Re-Opening Contract for Los Angeles County Metropolitan Transportation Authority (Metro), Contract #MS21001

SYNOPSIS: Contract #MS21001 provided up to \$1,148,742 for clean fuel bus service to Dodger Stadium in 2019. A total \$285,665 was reimbursed, and the contract was closed after receiving confirmation from Metro that no further invoices would be submitted. The remaining balance was reverted to the AB 2766 Discretionary Fund. Metro has now requested that the contract be re-opened and funded with unallocated funding. Metro requests to modify the types of expenses to be considered as co-funding, so that portions of the service operation costs would be included as co-funding. If approved, the MSRC would need to appropriate \$328,088 to re-open the contract.

FINANCIAL IMPACT: \$285,664.87 was paid under #MS21001. The contract balance of \$863,077.13 reverted to the AB 2766 Discretionary Fund when the contract was closed. Funds are available if the MSRC desires to appropriate \$328,088 to re-open the contract.

RECOMMENDATIONS: None

DISCUSSION: Contract #MS21001 provided Metro up to \$1,148,742 to provide clean fuel bus service to Dodger Stadium for 2019. All services were provided within the contract term.

\$285,664.87 was paid under #MS21001. Two invoices, for traffic control and security, were paid in July 2020, prior to the contract's termination date of July 29, 2020. A third invoice, for \$36,000 in operations costs, was paid in November 2020. Metro documented co-funding totaling \$571,034 in the form of direct promotion and outreach costs such as the design and production of bus card cards and rail posters, as well as labor for monitoring and reporting. At this point Metro confirmed that no further invoices would be submitted. When the contract

closed, \$863,077.13 reverted to the MSRC’s undesignated fund balance and was reported as such to the MSRC.

Metro has now requested that the contract be re-opened and funded with unallocated funding. Metro requests to modify the types of expenses to be considered as co-funding, so that portions of the service operation costs would be included as co-funding. The Program allowed this expense type to be counted as co-funding, and it would have been approved if originally proposed. Essentially, Metro is proposing that the payment schedule be changed as follows:

SYNOPSIS: The City of Fontana requests MSRC review of a two-year term extension request which has been denied by the MSRC Contracts Administrator. The City indicates the project has been further delayed due to extensive coordination with other agencies having jurisdiction, as well as the need to go through the courts to acquire the necessary right of way from a property owner. This project is part of the FYs 2014-16 Local Government Match Program.

FINANCIAL IMPACT: None

RECOMMENDATIONS: None

DISCUSSION:

Contractor: City of Fontana

Project Title: Enhance Existing Class 1 Bikeway

MSRC Funding: \$500,000

Project Term: January 6, 2017 to August 5, 2022

Current Request: Two-year term extension

Previous Requests: Two-year term extension; one-year term extension

Project Description: The City was awarded \$500,000 under the MSRC's FYs 2014-16 Local Government Match Program to help enhance the existing San Sevaine Class I Bikeway by paving an access segment, installing lights and installing fencing. The project is currently in the design phase and nothing has been paid to date on this contract.

Previous Requests: The project was originally expected to proceed through Caltrans' conventional encroachment permit process. It transpired that the project cost within the Caltrans right of way exceeded the encroachment permit threshold and the project needed to go through a Caltrans oversight process, adding at least one year to the project schedule. Additionally, two of the primary staff for the project left City employ, requiring new staff to be assigned and come up to speed. Finally, during the geotechnical boring work, the crew

accidentally hit a private water line. This had to be repaired, and the liability resolved, resulting in additional months of delay. The City requested, and the MSRC approved, a two-year contract term extension.

Later, the City reported that they were able to reach a critical milestone with a conditional approval of the Wall Type Selection Report with Caltrans. However, the City also was informed of the need to perform additional borings along Interstate 15. They needed to establish acceptable locations to perform the borings and an encroachment permit from Caltrans. Given this additional work and delay, the City requested, and the MSRC approved, a one-year term extension.

Contract Request: The City indicates that the project has been further delayed due to the need for extensive coordination with other agencies having jurisdiction, including Caltrans, San Bernardino County Flood Control District, and the City of Rancho Cucamonga. Additionally, the City has needed to go through the courts to acquire the necessary right of way from a property owner. They are still awaiting assignment of a hearing date for the Motion for Prejudgment Possession. The City currently estimates that the project will be ready for bidding in Fall 2022, with an expected start of construction in early 2023. In order to allow sufficient time for completion of construction, they requested a two-year term extension.

MSRC Contracts Administrator Review & Contractor Request for MSRC Review of Denial:In accordance with the MSRC's recently adopted Policy on Contract Modifications, the request was reviewed by the MSRC's Contracts Administrator. The first review is for completeness. Having satisfied those requirements, the request is then checked against a set list of pre-established criteria for denial. These criteria are intended to minimize subjectivity. The Contracts Administrator denied the City's request because it fell into the following category: the contract had previously been extended for a total of three years or more, and the current request is for greater than one year.

Also as established by the Policy on Contract Modifications, the Contractor has the right to request MSRC review if their extension request is denied by the Contracts Administrator. The City has exercised this option.

**SUBJECT: MSRC Contract No. ML16047 San Sevaine Trail, Segment 2
Request for Time Extension**

Dear Mr. Mackenzie,

The City of Fontana is requesting a two-year time extension for the San Sevaine Trail, Segment 2 Project (Contract Number ML16047). The term date for the contract is August 5, 2022. In order to meet this deadline, the majority of construction will need to be completed by June 30, 2022, in order to file all required closure paperwork.

The project is still in design as a result of extensive coordination with Caltrans, San Bernardino County Flood Control District (SBCFCD) and the City of Rancho Cucamonga. Additionally, activities continue for the acquisition of necessary right of way for the trail from one private property owner with a Resolution of Necessity approved by the Rancho City Council on January 19, 2022. We have since been processing the case through the San Bernardino County Courts. To date we have yet to be assigned a hearing date for the Motion for Prejudgment Possession.

The processing of the project through Caltrans as well as the need to go through the courts for the possession of the necessary easement has created further delays in the schedule. We are optimistic that our efforts will deem the project being ready for bidding in Fall 2022, however the bidding and awarding timelines will lead to an expected construction start date in early 2023. With a 9-month construction schedule, we will not be able to meet a deadline of August 2023 with only a one-year extension. It is for this reason that we are requesting an additional 2 years to ensure we can have construction completed by August 2024 barring any further delays by outside agencies.

With the required changes prompted by Caltrans and the delays in schedule which now have us bidding a project in a higher scale of economy, the total project cost has increased to \$8,200,000.00 with an MSRC grant amount of \$500,000. As we continue to process the project through the various agencies and the court system

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for right of way, we are also working on seeking out additional grant funding. All of these efforts continue to push the project timeline further along in the year.

The following schedule is the latest with the recent delay factored in:

- Design Approval by all Agencies – August 2022
(Caltrans, SBCFCD, City of Rancho Cucamonga)
- Award of possession of the necessary right of way by the Court-August 2022
- Advertise for Construction – September 2022
- Bid Opening – October 2022
- Agency Award of Construction Contract – November 2022
- Begin Construction Phase – January 2023
- Complete Construction – October 2023

With construction completion targeted for October 2023, this will allow for the necessary time to file all required completion forms by August 5, 2024.

While the complexities of the project have resulted in a longer delivery time, it is an important project that will greatly enhance non-motorized access to the regional trail network, schools, and other points of interest. After considerable effort, and an investment to date of \$768,000, the project is in the last stages of design. Denial of this request will create a funding shortfall, jeopardizing project delivery.
