This report provides a summary of outreach, communications and policy activities undertaken by the Better World Group on behalf of MSRC for Fall 2022.

For Approval - As Recommended

 Consider 16-Month No-Cost Term Extension by City of Laguna Hills, Contract #MS18099 (\$32,250 – Install EV Charging Infrastructure) Ravenstein

To fulfill the operational requirements of the Program, the City requests a 16-month term extension due to delays associated with the COVID pandemic and turnover in City management. The installations were completed in September 2021. This is the first extension on this contract. The MSRC Contracts Administrator recommends approval. **THE MSRC-TAC UNANIMOUSLY RECOMMENDS APPROVAL**

7. Consider Modified Scope and 4-Month No-Cost Term
Extension by City of Rialto, Contract #ML18159 (\$135,980 –
Procure Nine Light-Duty Zero Emission Vehicles and Install
EV Charging Infrastructure)

Ravenstein

The City installed 4 charging stations providing a total of 6 charging ports, while the contract specifies 6 charging stations. The City requests to modify the contract to specify the installation of charging stations providing a total of 6 ports. Additionally, the City indicates that a recall on battery packs for their chosen vehicles further delayed their procurement. The vehicles have been placed into service as of September 2022. After a previous one-year extension, the City requests to extend the contract term to September 19, 2025—approximately a 4-month extension. The MSRC Contracts Administrator recommends approval. THE MSRC-TAC UNANIMOUSLY RECOMMENDS APPROVAL

8. Consider Reduced Scope and Value and 16-Month No-Cost Term Extension by Capistrano Unified School District (CUSD), Contract #MS18108 (\$116,000 – Expand Existing CNG Station & Train Mechanics)

Ravenstein

CUSD indicates that mechanic training was not available during the project time frame, and they request elimination of tasks and \$4,250 associated with the training. Additionally, CUSD requests a 16-month term extension due to delays in receiving City approval of the Conditional Use Permit and plans. The issues were resolved and the station expansion was completed in September 2021. This is the first extension on this contract. The MSRC Contracts Administrator recommends approval. **THE MSRC-TAC UNANIMOUSLY RECOMMENDS APPROVAL**

 Consider Reduced Scope and Value by Universal Waste Systems (UWS), Contract #MS18122 (\$200,000 – Install New Limited Access CNG Infrastructure) Ravenstein

Contract #MS18122 calls for the installation of a CNG fueling station containing the following equipment at a minimum: compressors providing at least 900 standard cubic feet (SCF) per minute combined compression capability, six storage tanks (11,125 SCF each), one dual-hose fast-fill dispenser, and 50 dual-hose time-fill posts. UWS actually installed 30 dual-hose time-fill posts. They indicate that this was always their plan; the 50 figure was actually an error in their application. Because the application stated 50, this got included in the contract. UWS requests that the scope be reduced from 50 to 30. In consideration of the reduced scope, UWS also requests that the contract value be reduced by \$5,000. The MSRC Contracts Administrator recommends approval. THE MSRC-TAC UNANIMOUSLY RECOMMENDS APPROVAL

 Consider Increased Scope and 11-Month No-Cost Term Extension by City of Pico Rivera, Contract #ML18067 (\$83,500 – Install EV Charging Infrastructure) Ravenstein

The City requests to increase the number of charging stations to be provided under the contract. Instead of one public access and three limited access Level II stations, the City requests to install six dual-port public access Level II stations at no additional cost to the MSRC. After previously having been granted a 32-month extension, the City also requests an 11-month term extension due to delays associated with identifying an adequate power source for the stations. THE MSRC-TAC UNANIMOUSLY RECOMMENDS APPROVAL

11. Consider Modified Scope of Work by Penske Truck Leasing Co., L.P., Contract #MS21007 (\$1,000,000 – Deploy 5 Zero Emission Yard Tractors)

Ravenstein

Due to the unavailability of the Kalmar T2E terminal tractor specified in the contract, Penske requests to substitute the use of Orange EV eTriever 4X2 terminal tractors instead, at no additional cost to the MSRC. The MSRC Contracts Administrator recommends approval. **THE MSRC-TAC UNANIMOUSLY RECOMMENDS APPROVAL**

12. Consider 2-Year No-Cost Term Extension by City of Fontana, Contract #ML18144 (\$269,090 – Install Electric Vehicle Charging Infrastructure)

Ravenstein

The City indicates that the COVID-19 pandemic caused City, contractor, and Southern California Edison employee shortages as well as material delays and shortages, thereby delaying the project. A portion of the installations were further delayed due to a location change. The City requests an extension to December 31, 2025—approximately a 2-year extension. This would be the first extension on the contract. The MSRC Contracts Administrator recommends approval. **THE MSRC-TAC UNANIMOUSLY RECOMMENDS APPROVAL**

13. Consider Modified Scope and 29-Month No-Cost Term Extension by City of Temecula, Contract #ML18091 (\$141,000 – Install EV Charging Infrastructure)

Ravenstein

Contract #ML18091 specifies the installation of 16 charging stations. The City's plan has always been to install 8 dual-port stations in total. The City requests that the contract be modified to specify the installation of stations providing a total of 16 charging ports. Additionally, the City indicates that the costs to reconfigure the parking lot at one of their selected locations, coupled with personnel shortages associated with COVID-19, have delayed the installation of two of the dual-port stations. The City is now moving forward with plans to install these stations at another location and requests a 29-month term extension. This is the first extension on this contract. The MSRC Contracts Administrator recommends approval of the modified scope. The MSRC Contracts Administrator further recommends that should the MSRC wish to grant the City's request for an extension, the MSRC grant a 32-month extension to minimize the potential for additional extensions. THE MSRC-TAC UNANIMOUSLY RECOMMENDS APPROVAL OF MODIFIED PROJECT SCOPE AND 32-MONTH TERM EXTENSION, AS DESCRIBED IN ATTACHED STAFF REPORT

14. Consider Increased Scope by City of Eastvale, Contract #ML16040 (\$110,000 – Install EV Charging Infrastructure)

Ravenstein

The City has completed the Level III charger installation work originally specified by the contract, save for ongoing operational requirements. The City requests to utilize \$12,500 of the remaining \$56,091 contract balance to install an additional four Level II stations. Because the operational requirement for Level III stations is five years, while the requirement for Level II stations is only three years, the City estimates that they can complete the additional work without a term extension. The MSRC Contracts Administrator recommends that if the MSRC wishes to approve the increased scope, the MSRC also reduce the contract value to \$66,409 and approve a four-month term extension to minimize the potential for additional modifications. THE MSRC-TAC UNANIMOUSLY RECOMMENDS APPROVAL OF MODIFIED PROJECT SCOPE, REDUCTION OF CONTRACT VALUE BY \$66,409, AND 4-MONTH TERM EXTENSION, AS DESCRIBED IN ATTACHED STAFF REPORT

ACTION CALENDAR (Items 15 through 25)

 Consider 2-Year No-Cost Term Extension by City of Riverside, Contract #ML18063 (\$383,610 – Expand Existing CNG Stations) Ravenstein

The City requests a two-year term extension due to delays associated with previously approved changes in the project scope and major staffing shortages due to the COVID-19 pandemic. This is the first extension on this contract. The MSRC Contracts Administrator recommends a 14-month term extension, coupled with a reduced contract scope and value, eliminating the installation of the canopies at both locations and the installation of the dispenser at the Lincoln Avenue station, and reducing the total contract value by \$333,610. The remaining scope would be the installation of additional CNG storage spheres for \$50,000. THE MSRC-TAC UNANIMOUSLY RECOMMENDS APPROVAL OF A 14-MONTH TERM EXTENSION, REDUCED CONTRACT SCOPE, AND REDUCTION OF CONTRACT VALUE BY \$333,610, AS DESCRIBED IN ATTACHED STAFF REPORT

16. Consider One-Year No-Cost Term Extension by City of La Puente, Contract #ML18178 (\$25,000 – Purchase One Heavy-Duty Near-Zero Emission Vehicle)

Ravenstein

After previously having been granted a two-year term extension, the City requests a one-year term extension due to supply chain delays associated with vehicle delivery. The MSRC Contracts Administrator recommends approval, contingent on this being the final extension. THE MSRC-TAC UNANIMOUSLY RECOMMENDS APPROVAL, CONTINGENT ON THIS BEING THE FINAL EXTENSION

 Consider Modified Scope and 32-Month No-Cost Term Extension by City of Monterey Park, Contract #ML18093 (\$25,000 – Purchase One Heavy-Duty Near-Zero Emission Vehicle) Ravenstein

Due to the suspension of the City's Spirit Bus from April 2020 through July 2022, the purchase of a CNG bus to service an additional bus route was not completed. The City also experienced significant personnel changes during this period. Subsequently, the City determined that they would not be adding a bus route in the near future, but they are in need of a CNG asphalt truck. The City requests a 32-month term extension. This would be the first extension on the contract. The MSRC Contracts Administrator recommends approval, contingent on this being the final extension. The MSRC Contracts Administrator also recommends substitution of the asphalt truck for the transit bus. IN A 12-1 VOTE, THE MSRC-TAC RECOMMENDS APPROVAL, CONTINGENT ON THIS BEING THE FINAL EXTENSION

18. Consider One-Year No-Cost Term Extension by City of Yucaipa, Contract #ML16057 (\$380,000 – Implement "Complete Streets" Pedestrian Access Project)

Ravenstein

After previously having been granted extensions of a total length of four years, the City requests MSRC review of an additional one-year term extension request which has been denied by the MSRC Contracts Administrator. The City indicates that delays due to staffing shortages and COVID restrictions greatly increased the time for review and processing of the environmental documents, but CEQA documentation was finalized in August. THE MSRC-TAC UNANIMOUSLY RECOMMENDS APPROVAL OF A ONE-YEAR TERM EXTENSION, CONTINGENT UPON AWARD OF A CONSTRUCTION CONTRACT BY JANUARY 31, 2023

 Consider 4-Year No-Cost Term Extension by City of Perris, Contract #ML18058 (\$94,624 – Procure One Medium-Duty Zero Emission Vehicle and Install EV Charging Infrastructure) Ravenstein

The City requests MSRC review of a four-year term extension request which has been denied by the MSRC Contracts Administrator. The City indicates that lack of funding for the senior and youth programs which would use the new vehicle delayed progress on the project, but this has now been resolved. This is the first extension on this contract. **EXCEPT FOR AN ABSTENTION BY MEMBER CARDOSO, THE MSRC-TAC UNANIMOUSLY RECOMMENDS APPROVAL OF A FOUR-YEAR TERM EXTENSION WITH THE CONTINGENCY THAT THIS WILL BE THE FINAL EXTENSION, AND THAT A PURCHASE ORDER BE ISSUED BY FEBRUARY 28, 2023**

 Consider 32-Month No-Cost Term Extension by County of Los Angeles, Contract #ML14027 (\$492,000 - Construct New CNG Stations in Canyon Country and La Puente) Ravenstein

After previously having been granted extensions totaling 31 months, the County requests review of a 32-month term extension request which has been denied by the MSRC Contracts Administrator. The County indicates that equipment delivery delays experienced during the COVID-19 pandemic, as well as longer than anticipated time getting plans approved by Building and Safety and permits issued by Regional Planning, have delayed the project. They request a 32-month term extension to complete the installations and fulfill the operational requirements. IN A 11-1 VOTE, AND AN ABSTENTION BY MEMBER LE, THE MSRC-TAC RECOMMENDS APPROVAL OF A 32-MONTH TERM EXTENSION

21. Consider 3-Year No-Cost Term Extension by City of Montclair, Contract #ML18132 (\$40,000 – Install Electric Vehicle Charging Infrastructure)

Ravenstein

The City requests review of a 3-year term extension request which has been denied by the MSRC Contracts Administrator. The City indicates that the need to upgrade the electrical panel at the site, and longer than anticipated time to complete the design, have delayed the project. They request a 3-year term extension to complete the installation and fulfill the operational requirements. THE MSRC-TAC UNANIMOUSLY RECOMMENDS APPROVAL OF A 3-YEAR TERM EXTENSION

22. Consider Exercising Option with Geographics for Hosting and Maintenance of the MSRC Website

Ravenstein

Geographics currently hosts and maintains the www.CleanTransportationFunding.org website. This contract includes an option for a two-year period. MSRC staff recently reviewed Geographics' performance and found that Geographics was performing well in hosting and maintaining the site. MSRC staff recommends that the MSRC exercise the option, increasing the contract amount by \$7,200. EXCEPT FOR AN ABSTENTION BY MEMBER FARIN, THE MSRC-TAC UNANIMOUSLY RECOMMENDS APPROVAL

FYs 2021-24 WORK PROGRAM

23. Consider Request for Proposals for Micro-transit Operations

Gorski

At their October 2022 meeting, the MSRC authorized the development of a Request for Proposals (RFP) for micro-transit operations: shared transportation which fills the void between traditional "fixed route" transit and "ride hailing" technology. A proposed RFP has been prepared with input from the Innovative Transportation Subcommittee which establishes specific scoring criteria, including but not limited to cost-effectiveness and continuing operations planning. Vehicles performing services must be zero emission, and a geographic minimum of \$312,500 per county is included in order to ensure broad-based participation. The Subcommittee recommends a targeted funding amount of \$2.5 million. EXCEPT FOR AN ABSTENTION BY ALTERNATE MEMBER IANNOCCONE, THE MSRC-TAC UNANIMOUSLY RECOMMENDS APPROVAL

24. Receive Status Update and Consider Redeploying Funding for Plus Up Partnership with South Coast AQMD

Ravenstein

As an element of their FYs 2018-21 Work Program, the MSRC partnered with the South Coast AQMD for a Plus Up Incentive. The MSRC subsequently extended the date for application acceptance under the Plus Up partnership to August 31, 2022, as well as extending the deadline for delivery of the replacement vehicle to December 31, 2023. South Coast AQMD has completed their evaluation of applications received by the August 31, 2022 deadline. A total of 12 projects were approved for Plus Up incentives. 6 projects have already been completed and reimbursed. For the 6 projects which have been approved, but not yet completed, a total of \$655,000 in Plus Up funding would continue to be reserved through March 31, 2024. MSRC staff recommend that the remaining \$1,255,000 allocated for this program revert to the AB 2766 Discretionary Fund. EXCEPT FOR ABSTENTIONS BY MEMBERS NIKRAVAN AND WINTERS, THE MSRC-TAC UNANIMOUSLY RECOMMEND THE REMAINING BALANCE OF \$1,255,000 REVERT TO THE AB 2766 **DISCRETIONARY FUND**

25. Receive Status Update and Consider Redeploying Funding for South Coast AQMD Trade Up Program

Ravenstein

In November 2019, the MSRC allocated \$4,000,000 to partner with South Coast AQMD to implement a Market Acceleration Program to encourage the early deployment of near-zero emission natural gas trucks. In August 2020, the MSRC reallocated \$3,000,000 of this funding to a separate South Coast AQMD program, the Trade Up Program. Subsequently, the MSRC approved adjustments to the Program. Due to COVID-19 driven supply chain issues, no truck trade up transactions have been accomplished. South Coast AQMD is now formulating an alternative work scope which promises to be significantly different than the original. MSRC staff recommend that the \$3,000,000 allocated for this program revert to the AB 2766 Discretionary Fund. EXCEPT FOR ABSTENTIONS BY MEMBERS NIKRAVAN AND WINTERS, THE MSRC-TAC UNANIMOUSLY RECOMMEND THE REMAINING BALANCE OF \$3,000,000 REVERT TO THE AB 2766 DISCRETIONARY FUND

SYNOPSIS: This action is to adopt the attached Resolution finding that the

MSRC: 1) has reconsidered the circumstances of the state of emergency; and 2) state or local officials continue to impose or recommend measures to promote social distancing. See Cal. Gov't

Code section 54953(e)(3).

RECOMMENDATION: Adopt the attached Resolution finding that the MSRC: 1) has

reconsidered the circumstances of the state of emergency; and 2)

state or local officials continue to impose or recommend

measures to promote social distancing.

FINANCIAL IMPACTS: None

<u>Background</u>: Governor Newsom previously issued Executive Orders (EOs) N-29-20 and N-35-2 in March 2020, as a response to the public health crisis brought about by the COVID-19 pandemic. These EOs authorized local legislative bodies subject to the Ralph M. Brown Act to conduct meetings entirely via telephonic or other electronic means in lieu of requiring the physical presence of Board members or members of the public. On June 11, 2021 the Governor issued EO N-08-21, which continued suspension of the Brown Act's teleconferencing requirements, without requiring that members of the public be given the right to access all teleconference locations, through September 30, 2021, in anticipation of the State's proposed re-opening.

Assembly Bill 361, signed into law by Governor Newsom on September 16, 2021, amends the Brown Act and will stay in effect from October 1, 2021 until January 1, 2024. In part, AB 361 amends subparagraph (e) of section 54953 of the California Government Code to state that local agencies may continue to use teleconferencing without complying with the teleconferencing requirements of the Brown Act in any of the following circumstances:

A. When the legislative body holds a meeting during a proclaimed state of emergency and state or local officials have imposed or recommended measures to propose social distancing;

- B. When the legislative body holds a meeting during a proclaimed state of emergency for the purpose of determining, by majority vote, whether as a result of the emergency, meeting in person would present imminent risks to the health or safety of attendees; or
- C. When the legislative body holds a meeting during a proclaimed state of emergency and has already determined, by majority vote, pursuant to subparagraph (B), that, as a result of the emergency, meeting in person would present imminent risks to the health or safety of attendees.

In the event of an ongoing proclaimed state of emergency, or where state or local officials have imposed or recommended measures to promote social distancing, in order to continue to utilize the teleconferencing measures set forth above, a legislative body must, no later than 30 days after teleconferencing for the first time pursuant to Government Code section 54953(e)(1), and every 30 days thereafter, make the following findings by majority vote:

- A. The legislative body has reconsidered the circumstances of the state of emergency.
- B. Any of the following circumstances exist:
 - i. The state of emergency continues to directly impact the ability of the members to meet safely in person; or
 - ii. State or local officials continue to impose or recommend measures to promote social distancing.

See Cal. Gov't Code section 54953(e)(1). Governor Newsom first declared a statewide emergency resulting from the COVID-19 pandemic on March 4, 2020. Furthermore, although the State no longer requires physical distancing, the MSRC meetings are generally held at the South Coast AQMD headquarters located in Diamond Bar, California, which is a city in Los Angeles County and both South Coast AQMD and the Los Angeles County Department of Public Health have recommended social distancing measures.

Recommendations: This action is to address the requirements of AB 361 to allow the MSRC to continue to meet remotely. The recommended action is to adopt the attached Resolution finding that the MSRC: 1) has reconsidered the circumstances of the state of emergency; and 2) state or local officials continue to impose or recommend measures to promote social distancing. See Cal. Gov't Code section 54953(e)(3).

A RESOLUTION OF THE MOBILE SOURCE AIR POLLUTION REDUCTION REVIEW COMMITTEE RECOGNIZING THE PROCLAMATION OF A STATE OF EMERGENCY BY GOVERNOR NEWSOM ON MARCH 4, 2020 AND THAT THE COUNTY OF LOS ANGELES CONTINUES TO RECOMMEND MEASURES TO PROMOTE SOCIAL DISTANCING; AND AUTHORIZING FULLY OR PARTIALLY REMOTE TELECONFERENCE MEETINGS OF THE MOBILE SOURCE AIR POLLUTION REDUCTION REVIEW COMMITTEE, THE TECHNICAL ADVISORY COMMITTEE TO THE MOBILE SOURCE AIR POLLUTION REDUCTION REVIEW COMMITTEE, AND THEIR COMMITTEES OR SUBCOMMITTEES, INCLUDING ANY WORKING GROUP MEETINGS WHERE A QUORUM OF MEMBERS ARE PRESENT, SUBJECT TO THE BROWN ACT, FOR THE PERIOD OF DECEMBER 15, 2022 THROUGH JANUARY 14, 2023 PURSUANT TO PROVISIONS OF THE BROWN ACT.

WHEREAS, the Mobile Source Air Pollution Reduction Review Committee (MSRC) is committed to preserving and nurturing public access and participation in all meetings subject to the provisions of the Ralph M. Brown Act (Cal. Gov't Code §§ 54950 – 54963, hereafter Brown Act); and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the provisions of the Brown Act, all meetings of legislative bodies of the MSRC, which include the MSRC, its MSRC Technical Advisory Committee (MSRC-TAC), all Brown Act standing committees of the MSRC and MSRC-TAC ultimately reporting to the MSRC and MSRC-TAC, and any working group meetings where a quorum of the MSRC or MSRC-TAC members are present, (collectively, hereinafter, "legislative bodies"), are required to be open and public so that any member of the public may attend, participate, and watch the MSRC's legislative bodies conduct their business; and

WHEREAS, the Brown Act, Government Code section 54953(e), makes provisions for remote teleconferencing participation in meetings by members of a legislative body, without compliance with the requirements of Government Code section 54953(b)(3), subject to the existence of certain conditions; and

WHEREAS, a required condition is that a state of emergency has been declared by the Governor pursuant to Government Code section 8625, proclaiming the existence of conditions of disaster or of extreme peril to the safety of persons and property within the state caused by conditions as described in Government Code section 8558; and

WHEREAS, on March 4, 2020 the Governor proclaimed a State of Emergency to exist in California as a result of the threat of the novel coronavirus (COVID-19); and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Health & Safety Code section 44244, the MSRC and its MSRC-TAC are to adopt or assist in the development of a work program that is to be submitted to the south coast district board. The South Coast Air Quality Management District includes all of the County of Orange and portions

of the Counties of Los Angeles, Riverside, and San Bernardino as set forth in Health & Safety Code section 40410 and South Coast AQMD Rule 103; and

WHEREAS, the legislative bodies usually meet at the South Coast AQMD headquarters, which is located in the County of Los Angeles; and

WHEREAS, it is further required that state or local officials have imposed or recommended measures to promote social distancing, or, the legislative body meeting would present imminent risks to the health and safety of attendees; and

WHEREAS, local and California public authorities still recommend measures promoting social distancing and/or mask wearing indoors and in public gatherings as well as recommending compliance with the latest advice issued by the Center for Disease Control (CDC) regarding same; and

WHEREAS, on March 14, 2022, the County of Los Angeles Department of Public Health issued further guidance promoting such measures; and

WHEREAS, on June 23 and August 10, 2021, the South Coast AQMD issued further guidance promoting such measures; and

WHEREAS, the spread of COVID-19 poses a continued risk to the health and safety of members of the MSRC legislative bodies, support staff, as well as to any members of the general public who attend such meetings in that unvaccinated or partially vaccinated persons are at high risk of contracting COVID-19 and even fully vaccinated persons can contract and potentially unknowingly spread COVID-19; and

WHEREAS, the MSRC does hereby find that the legislative bodies of the MSRC shall conduct their meetings without compliance with paragraph (3) of subdivision (b) of Government Code section 54953, as authorized by subdivision (e) of section 54953, and that such legislative bodies shall comply with the requirements to provide the public with access to the meetings as prescribed in paragraph (2) of subdivision (e) of section 54953; and

WHEREAS, the legislative bodies of the MSRC will continue to ensure access to their meetings by making them available telephonically and via virtual access for both members of the legislative bodies and the general public; and

WHEREAS, notice of meetings along with information regarding all methods which may be used for public participation in such meetings will continue to be posted at the South Coast AQMD's

1	headquarters, posted at any teleconference locations which are officially noticed on the agenda, posted on

<u>Project Description</u>: The City was awarded \$135,980 under the MSRC's FYs 2016-18 Local Government Partnership Program (LGPP) towards the procurement of 9 light-duty zero emission vehicles and the installation of six electric vehicle charging stations. The charging stations have been completed and nothing has been paid to date on this contract.

<u>Previous Requests</u>: The City indicated that they experienced delays as a result of the COVID-19 pandemic in addition to the loss of key project personnel. The City requested a one-year term extension. This modification was processed administratively.

<u>Contract Request</u>: The City decided that the same number of vehicle charging ports could be provided more efficiently through the use of some dual-port charging stations. As such, the City requests to change the contract specifications to require them to specify the installation of charging stations providing a total of 6 ports. There would be no substantive change to the infrastructure being provided.

The City also states that project completion was further delayed as a result of a recall on the Chevy Bolt battery packs. Production of the vehicle was halted until the issue was resolved. The City has now taken delivery of the vehicles and placed them into service on September 19, 2022. The City requests a contract term extension to September 19, 2025—approximately a four-month term extension--in order to fulfill the LGPP three-year operational requirement.

<u>Recommendations</u>: The MSRC Contracts Administrator recommends approval because work is complete. The MSRC-TAC reviewed the request and recommends approval.

The City of Rialto would like to request an extension for the City of Rialto's ELECTRIC VEHICLE AND ELECTRIC VEHICLE CHARGING STATION grant as well as modify the language of the Project Elements portion of the Statement of Work.

Proposed extension - MSRC Contract #ML18159

The City of Rialto would like to propose the following adjustments for the City of Rialto's Electric Vehicle & Electric Vehicle Charging Station Grant. The current contract expiration was May 12, 2025. We would like to propose the contract end date be extended by 4 months.

The City of Rialto experienced delays in the project completion as a result of the recall of the Chevy Bolt battery packs. The vehicle was completely redesigned, and production halted until the problem/concern was resolved. The vehicles were delivered at the end of August 2022 and placed into service on September 19, 2022.

Staff is requesting a grant extension of <u>4 months</u> which will allow the City to fulfill the three year in-service grant requirement. The schedule below outlines the project tasks and an estimated date of completion.

In addition, I would like to clarify that the City installed four (4) charging stations with a total of six (6) charging ports and not six (6) charging stations as originally described in the Attachment 1 Statement of Work. These stations were installed and functional in January of 2022.

Project Term: January 1, 2019 to July 18, 2023

Current Request: Reduced scope and value and 16-month term extension

Previous Requests: None

<u>Project Description</u>: CUSD was awarded \$116,000 under the MSRC's FYs 2016-18 Natural Gas Infrastructure Program towards the expansion of their existing CNG fueling station through the installation of additional time-fill posts and to provide mechanic training. The station expansion has been completed and nothing has been paid to date on this contract.

<u>Contract Request</u>: CUSD indicates that CNG mechanic training was not available during the project time frame. They request to eliminate the tasks and \$4,250 associated with this training. If the MSRC approves this request, the contract value would be reduced to \$111,750 and the \$4,250 would revert to the AB 2766 Discretionary Fund.

CUSD states that there was no delay in the construction phase of their CNG station expansion, however, the time to receive City approval of the Conditional Use Permit was much greater than expected. Most of this issue centered on a misapprehension that the project would generate increased noise. Once this misunderstanding was resolved, given that there would be no change in the compressor, the project was able to proceed and the expansion was completed in September 2021. CUSD requests a 16-month term extension in order to fulfill the Natural Gas Infrastructure Program five-year operational requirement.

<u>Recommendations</u>: The MSRC Contracts Administrator recommends approval. The MSRC-TAC reviewed the request and concurs with the MSRC Contracts Administrator's recommendation.

Project completion status- Project complete – Notice of Completion was filed and recorded on 12/15/21.

Reason for delay- The construction phase of the project was not delayed, however, it did take a long time for the City to approve the CUP/MND and the submitted plans which required several revisions and site meetings with the City planning department to approve our plans. The main issue was that the surrounding residents were under the impression that the CNG Station would create additional sound impact to the community, but what the City was unaware of was that the CNG pump was not being exchanged or increased as we installed a larger pump during phase 1. Once that was recognized, the City moved forward with adding our plans to their agenda which required two Board meetings for opportunities for community input. See attached Resolution, Staff Report and CUSD Presentation that further supports the timeline taken by Placeworks, the planning consultant who navigated the CUP and MND process with the City.

Consequences of denial- Consequences of denial would result in a cost that was not planned or budgeted for negatively impacting district infrastructure repair, which is payed for by the general fund.

Additional amendment's- The original awarded amount was for a total of \$116,000.00. \$4,250.00 of the award was meant for CNG equipment training. Such training was not available within the time frame. The amended amount requested for the award, less the training funds is now &111,750.00.

<u>Project Description</u>: UWS was awarded \$200,000 under the MSRC's FYs 2016-18 Natural Gas Infrastructure Program towards installation of a new CNG fueling station containing, at a minimum: a new gas line and meter, compressors providing at least 900 standard cubic feet (SCF) per minute combined compression capability, six storage tanks (11,125 SCF each), one dual-hose fast-fill dispenser, and 50 dual-hose time-fill posts. Contract #MS18122 was executed

to effectuate the award. The station installation has been completed and nothing has been paid to date on this contract.

<u>Previous Requests</u>: UWS indicated that construction was delayed, primarily due to delays associated with Southern California Gas assuring adequate flow to the site. UWS requested a one-year term extension. This modification was processed administratively.

Later, UWS indicated that the COVID-19 pandemic had impacted their ability to complete permitting with the City of South Gate, and the process to get power delivered by Southern California Edison was taking longer than anticipated. They anticipated having the electrical signed off within the next 30 days and would begin the construction for power delivery to the site. They requested, and the MSRC approved, a one-year term extension.

Lastly, in June 2022, UWS communicated that the station was fully installed, but there had been delays getting Southern California Gas to connect the gas line. UWS requested, and the MSRC approved, a four-month term extension.

Contract Request: UWS submitted a Final Report for the project. In reviewing the report, MSRC staff noted that UWS had installed 30 dual-hose time-fill posts, while Contract #MS18122 calls for the installation of 50 dual-hose posts. This led to the determination that there was an error in UWS' original application. UWS had always intended to install 30 dual-hose posts, but they specified 50 in their application. The application was approved as written, and Contract #MS18122 was executed based upon the specifications therein. UWS now requests that the scope be reduced from 50 to 30 time-fill posts. In consideration of the reduced scope, UWS also requests that the contract value be reduced by \$5,000. If the MSRC approves this request, the contract value would be reduced to \$195,000 and the \$5,000 would revert to the AB 2766 Discretionary Fund.

<u>Recommendations</u>: The MSRC Contracts Administrator recommends approval. The MSRC-TAC reviewed the request and recommends approval.

In reviewing the application for the grant, we did not notice that our grant writer stated that we would be installing 50 dual-hose time-fill posts for a total of 100 hoses when in fact our plan was for 30 post for a total of 60 hoses. This was simply a mistake that was not caught in our final review of our application and therefore it was included in the contract.

We are requesting that the contract be modified to reflect the actual number of dual-hose time-fill posts that were installed, which is 30. Included in our request for modification, we are offering to have the grant reduced by \$5,000 due to this mistake and as a way to offset the additional administrative time spent by the MSRC staff.

Project Title: Install Electric Vehicle Charging Infrastructure

MSRC Funding: \$83,500

Project Term: September 7, 2018 to July 6, 2025

Current Request: Increased scope and 11-month term extension

Previous Requests: 32-month term extension

<u>Project Description</u>: The City was awarded \$83,500 under the MSRC's FYs 2016-18 Local Government Partnership Program (LGPP) towards the installation of electric vehicle charging stations: one public-access and 3 limited-access. No construction work has been completed and nothing has been paid to date on this contract.

<u>Previous Requests</u>: The City indicated that unforeseen COVID-19 impacts on City services and issues regarding power supply by Southern California Edison delayed the design schedule. The City requested, and the MSRC approved, a 32-month term extension.

<u>Contract Request</u>: The City indicates that they would like to increase the number of stations to be installed. Instead of the single public-access station and three limited-access stations

called for by the contract, the City now proposes to install six dual-port, 24/7 public-access charging stations at no additional cost to the MSRC. The City would provide a 25% match as required for public-access stations under the LGPP.

Issues regarding power supply for the stations resulted in greater delays than previously anticipated. Ultimately, an existing transformer at the adjacent Pico Rivera Sheriff Station was identified which had the capacity to power the stations. The City is working to apply for Southern California Edison's Charge Ready program. Design work has been initiated, and the City has expended approximately \$15,000 in project management and design. The City requests an 11-month term extension would suffice for these stations to be made fully operational and fulfillment of the LGPP three-year operational requirement.

<u>Recommendations</u>: The MSRC-TAC reviewed the request and recommends approval.

Project Statement of Work Modification, Progress Report, and Extension Request, MSRC Contract #ML18067 – Funding for Electric Vehicle Charging Equipment, (Pico Rivera CIP No. 50010)

Dear Ms. Ravenstein,

The City of Pico Rivera respectfully requests to modify the Statement of Work and extend the expiration of MSRC Contract #ML18067 that was originally executed on September 7, 2018 which is currently set to expire on July 6, 2025. The original Statement of Work specified for the City to install one (1) "Level II" type EV charging station at City Hall, 6615 Passons Boulevard, Pico Rivera, California to be accessible to the public 24 hours per day, 7 days per week. It also specified for the City to install three (3) "Level II" type EV charging stations at City Hall with limited access.

While the City intends to fully implement the Statement of Work, the City would like to increase the total number of "Level II" type EV charging stations to six (6) dual output charging stations at City Hall for a total of twelve (12) charging ports and requests the increase to be eligible for AB 2766 Discretionary Funds. The City would also like to offer all 12 ports to be accessible to the public 24 hours per day, 7 days per week, instead of limiting access of 3 charging stations to City fleet vehicles only and is committing to provide the 25% local match for all 6 charging stations. However, in order to meet the 3-year Operational Availability requirement, all stations would have needed to be in operation since July 6, 2022 which the City was unable to accomplish. Staff, however, has made tremendous progress and is continuing to do so to ensure construction is completed by June 2023.

Project Completion Status

Over the past few months, staff has been working with Southern California Edison (SCE) to apply for the SCE Charge Ready Infrastructure and Rebate Program to help the City identify, design, and construct a power source to provide power to the proposed charging stations. The City's application

was subsequently approved and the City entered into an agreement with SCE to proceed with the program on August 31, 2022 (see Attachment 1).

The City is currently in the process of procuring 6 dual output charging stations by the end of November 2022 to meet SCE's Charge Ready Infrastructure and Rebate Program schedule. A quote was originally received from ChargePoint for 6 CT4021 Dual Output charging stations through a cooperative purchasing program (see Attachment 2). Unfortunately, SCE notified staff that the CT4021 models are no longer on their Approved Product List as they do not meet ISO 15118 requirements set by the California Public Utilities Commission (CPUC), so the City is also exploring alternative options with Tellus Power (see Attachment 3).

The City has entered into an agreement with Willdan Engineering for the design of the charging station and parking lot improvements which is currently underway. Construction will be bid and commence shortly after completion of design and SCE anticipates having the power source ready and operational within approximately 7 months from November 2022. A breakdown of the revised schedule is shown below:

Length of Extension Requested

Based on the schedule above, the estimated completion date for the charging stations to be fully operational is June 2023. In order to meet the 3-year Operational Availability requirement of the MSRC grant, the City respectfully requests an extension of 11 months to June, 6, 2026. The City understands and is grateful that the MRSC has already granted an extension to the City's grant until July 6, 2025 which unfortunately, the City will not be able to meet due to preliminary design challenges.

Reasons for Delay

The greatest challenge and reason for delay was finding a viable power source for the City Hall charging stations as SCE had originally denied the City's request to install an additional service to

the City Hall location to power the charging stations as there is already a maximum number of existing services to the property. Various alternatives were explored, including connecting to the existing City Hall electrical panel, but a preliminary inspection revealed that it did not have sufficient capacity to power the number of charging stations specified in the MSRC grant Statement of Work.

Through staff's continued effort working with SCE, an existing transformer at the adjacent Pico Rivera Sheriff Station was identified as a potential option. The transformer is adjacent to the proposed locations of the charging stations and has the capacity, so it was determined to be a viable solution. A plan was subsequently developed and approved by SCE to branch off the existing transformer to provide power to the charging stations which served as the basis to move forward with the SCE Charge Ready Infrastructure and Rebate Program. Although the City has overcome this challenge, the project completion date is dependent on SCE's implementation schedule which is anticipated to be complete by June 2023.

Consequences of Denial

Should the MSRC deny the City's request for extension, noncancellable expenses already incurred by the City are administrative costs and project management costs for coordination with SCE and ChargePoint. These costs would also extend to SCE, ChargePoint, and the City's design consultants for the efforts expended to coordinate with the City to progress the project to this point. Additionally, the City would be responsible to reimburse 33% of the MSRC Funds as it will only be in compliance for 2 years of the required 3-year Operational Availability if the contract expiration date remains at July 6, 2025.

Offers for Consideration

The City of Pico Rivera respectfully asks the MRSC to consider the extension and modification requests as the City is now committed to installing triple the amount of ports for electric vehicle charging, from 4 to 12, as originally required by the Statement of Work. The ports will also be made accessible to the public 24 hours per day, 7 days per week, instead of limiting the majority of them to City fleet use only. These requests will provide added benefits to the community and will help to further promote the reduction in air pollution from motor vehicles.

<u>Project Description:</u> The MSRC originally awarded Penske \$1,160,000 under the FYs 2018-21 Off-Road Inland Ports Program to procure and deploy five Tesla Kalmar T2E terminal tractors and to install electric vehicle charging infrastructure. Subsequently, a determination was made that the charging infrastructure would be owned and operated by property owner Costco Wholesale Corporation (Costco), and the award was bifurcated into a \$1,000,000 award to Penske and a \$160,000 award to Costco. No work has been completed and nothing has been paid to date.

<u>Contract Request:</u> Penske now indicates that the Kalmar T2E terminal tractors are not available. Penske proposes to substitute comparable zero emission equipment. MHX requests to substitute the procurement of five Orange EV eTriever 4X2 terminal tractors.

The proposed Orange EV terminal tractors carry a higher price tag than the original Kalmar terminal tractors. Penske is seeking additional funding through California's Clean Off-Road Equipment (CORE) Program, but commits to covering the additional project costs if they are not otherwise able to defray them. There will be no additional cost to the MSRC.

<u>Recommendations:</u> The MSRC-TAC reviewed the request and recommends approval. The MSRC Contracts Administrator recommends approval.

Penske Truck Leasing Co., LP (Penske) is pleased to have been selected for the South Coast Air Quality Management District's (SCAQMD) Mobile Source Air Pollution Reduction Review Committee (MSRC) Clean Transportation Funding, #P2021-08. The original proposal would replace five (5) diesel powered off-road terminal tractors and deploy newly procured *Kalmar T2E* electric models, as well as associated charging infrastructure, to support goods movement at our fleet partner's distribution center in Mira Loma, CA. Penske is eager to deploy critical zero-emission technologies to immediately reduce emissions and improve air quality. But the original scope of work to deploy Kalmar T2E's is now no longer possible. We have received word that the OEM has since discontinued the specific model and will not meet previous orders. As such we are notifying MSRC that we will be utilizing a new vendor for the project, specifically OrangeEV. As such, Penske would like to request an amendment to our Grant Agreement (MS21007) to accommodate this Scope change.

Penske will not adjust the original requests of \$1,160,000, or \$200,000 per yard truck with \$32,000 per unit for supportive charging infrastructure. In addition to the budget, the timeline will not be impacted by this development. Penske will still pursue Clean Off-Road Equipment (CORE) Voucher Incentive Program funds and commits to covering the remaining \$466,250 project costs as match-share funding which may be offset by additional CORE vouchers or other off-road funding.

Penske appreciates the opportunity to pursue this deployment and is committed to reducing emissions and supporting California's clean air goals. Support from MSRC is critical for achieving Penske's sustainability goals and the larger goal of accelerating the market for advanced zero-emission solutions. Contractor: City of Fontana

Project Title: Install Electric Vehicle Charging Infrastructure

MSRC Funding: \$269,090

Project Term: October 4, 2019 to December 3, 2023

Current Request: 2-year term extension

Previous Requests: Specify 12 charging ports instead of 12 charging stations

<u>Project Description</u>: The City was awarded \$269,090 under the MSRC's FYs 2016-18 Local Government Partnership Program (LGPP) towards the installation of 12 publicly accessible Level II charging stations. This was subsequently modified to specify that the City needed to provide a combined total of 12 charging ports. 4 stations, providing a combined total of 6 charging ports, have been installed, and nothing has been paid to date on this contract.

<u>Previous Requests</u>: For efficiency purposes, the City requested to substitute the installation of four single-port stations and four dual-port stations for the twelve stations specified in the contract. They would still be installing twelve charging ports. The MSRC and the South Coast AQMD Governing Board approved the modification.

<u>Contract Request</u>: The City opted to proceed with the installations in two phases. While the stations were originally anticipated to be installed in two different locations, after the first phase was complete in May 2021, the City revised their plans and decided to install the remaining stations in the City Hall/Police Department area as well. The contract does allow for location changes within the City limits.

The City indicates that both phases of station installation were impacted by City, contractor, and Southern California Edison employee shortages as well as material delays and shortages associated with the COVID-19 pandemic. The second phase was further impacted by the decision to switch locations. The City requests an extension to December 31, 2025—approximately a 2-year term extension—to allow sufficient time to complete the remaining installations and fulfill the required five-year operational period. This would be the first extension on the contract.

[Note: the City's letter makes reference to being required to reimburse South Coast AQMD a percentage of the funding if their request is not approved. This reflects a misunderstanding of the contract provisions; the referenced contractor reimbursement provision comes into play if a contract deliverable such as a charging station unexpectedly ceases to operate during the required operational period. The City will not receive **any** reimbursement if the MSRC does not extend their contract.]

<u>Recommendations</u>: The MSRC-TAC reviewed the request and recommends approval. The MSRC Contracts Administrator recommends approval.

The City of Fontana is requesting a Contract Modification to MSRC Contract #ML18144/Funding for EV Charging Infrastructure. The original scope of work was to purchase and install twelve (12) electric vehicle charging stations, including all necessary infrastructure work, electrical, paving, striping, and EV legend improvement as needed to facilitate the use and ease of public accessible Charging Stations 24 hours per day, 7 days per week. The City of Fontana decided to complete the Project in two (2) Phases at two different locations.

- Phase 1 City Hall/Police Department
 - Installation of new electrical infrastructure and installation of (6) new Charge Point EV chargers in parking lot; two (2) dual level 2 CT-4021 and two (2) level 2 CT-4011 single ports. Along with spare conduits for two (2) future dual level 2 and two (2) single 50kW DC Fast chargers. Contract amount \$200,545.97.
 - ♦ Started January 2021 Completed May 2021
 - Length of Extension Requested May 2024
 - ♦ New Project Schedule Not Applicable
 - ◆ Project Completion Status Complete
 - Reason for Delay COVID 19 which caused City, Contractor, and SCE employee shortage along with material delays and shortage.
 - Consequences of Denial City will be required to reimburse SCAQMD up to 33% of the funds allocated for the Project Phase I

Due to delay mention above, the Project was postponed for approximately a year and a half (1.5) however, Phase I is now complete.

- Phase 2 Center Stage/HR
 - Installation of new electrical infrastructure and installation of (6) new Charge Point EV chargers in parking lot; two (2) dual level 2 CT-4021 and two (2) level 2 CT-4011 single ports. **Contract amount \$158,527.53**. However, the City revised the location of Phase II thereby, moving the remaining six (6) EV Charging Stations form Center Stage/HR to City Hall/Police Department area.
 - Construction to Start November 15, 2022 and be complete December 16, 2022
 - ◆ Length of Extension Requested December 31, 2025



Additionally, the City indicates that the costs to reconfigure the parking lot at one of their selected locations, coupled with personnel shortages associated with COVID-19, have delayed the installation of two of the dual-port stations. The City is now moving forward with plans to install these stations at another location and requests a 29-month term extension. This is the first extension on this contract. This project is part of the FYs

2016-18 Local Government Partnership Program.

FINANCIAL IMPACT: None

RECOMMENDATIONS: The MSRC Contracts Administrator recommends approval of the

modified scope. The MSRC Contracts Administrator further recommends that should the MSRC wish to grant the City's request for an extension, the MSRC grant a 32-month extension to minimize the potential for additional extensions. The MSRC-TAC considered the request and recommends approval of the

Project Title: Install Electric Vehicle Charging Infrastructure

MSRC Funding: \$141,000

Project Term: January 1, 2019 to July 18, 2023

Current Request: Modified scope and 29-month term extension

Previous Requests: None

<u>Project Description</u>: The City was awarded \$141,000 under the MSRC's FYs 2016-18 Local Government Partnership Program (LGPP) towards the installation of sixteen public access

electric vehicle charging stations. Six dual-port charging stations have been completed and nothing has been paid to date on this contract.

<u>Contract Request</u>: The City's original LGPP application variously referred to the charging infrastructure to be installed both as 16 stations (cover letter) and as 8 dual-port stations (cost schedule). Contract #ML18091 used the 16-station nomenclature. The City has now indicated that their plan was always the installation of 8 dual-port stations. As such, the City requests to change the contract specifications to require them to specify the installation of charging stations providing a total of 16 ports. There would be no substantive change to the infrastructure being provided.

To date, the City has completed installing and entering into service 6 dual-port charging stations in three locations: Sixth Street Parking Lot, Civic Center Parking Structure, and Temecula Park & Ride. The latest of these entered service in July 2019. The final 2 dual-port stations were intended to be installed at the Ronald H. Roberts Temecula Public Library. However, during the construction of the new parking facility at the Library, the City encountered high costs to reconfigure the parking lot and install the required utility infrastructure, which precluded installation at the intended location. Additional delays were caused by the COVID-19 pandemic including absenteeism, remote working conditions, and unavailability of contracting services.

The City indicates that they are committed to completing the project, and are now looking to expand the charging services at the Temecula Park & Ride location. They are confident that the remaining chargers can be installed there by December 31, 2022. The City requests a contract term extension to December 31, 2025—approximately a 29-month term extension—in order to fulfill the LGPP three-year operational requirement.

[The City's letter notes that they have not been reimbursed for their completed work to date. Provided that the project specifications are modified as requested to accommodate the dual-port chargers, the City can be reimbursed for the six completed stations regardless of the MSRC's decision on the extension request because these stations have fulfilled their operational requirements within the current contract term].

<u>Recommendations</u>: The MSRC Contracts Administrator recommends approval of the modified scope. The MSRC Contracts Administrator further recommends that should the MSRC wish to grant the City's request for an extension, the MSRC grant a 32-month extension to minimize the potential for additional extensions. The MSRC-TAC considered the request and recommends approval of the modified scope and a 32-month term extension.

Pursuant to our telephone conversation on Wednesday, September 28, 2022, at 3:00 pm, the City of Temecula hereby requests to extend the terms of the existing Contract #ML18091 to December 31, 2025. The original term of the agreement is due to end on July 19, 2023.

As discussed, the City of Temecula has completed a significant portion of the work to date, to install new electric vehicle charging stations, as proposed in our original letter funding request, dated July 13, 2018, at various locations throughout the city. The proposed project was to install 16 new electric vehicle charging stations, but outlined an estimated cost for the installations for the purchase of eight (8) dual port output charging stations. This was to reduce the overall cost to procure the equipment, as well as to accommodate the charging stations within the space available at each city-owned location.

To fulfill all the requirements for our request to extend the contract terms, we have addressed each condition as follows;

Length of Extension Requested:

Extend to December 2025 – This will allow adequate time to complete the installation of the two (2) remaining dual port output charging stations, and provide for the required operational performance period of three (3) years from the date of station operations

New Project Schedule:

Installation & Energizing of two (2) remaining dual port output charging stations
Scheduled to be Complete – October - December 2022

Project Completion Status:

To date, we have installed and energized the following;

- Sixth Street Parking Lot Two (2) Dual Port Output Electric Vehicle Charging Stations
- Civic Center Parking Structure Two (2) Dual Port Output Electric Vehicle Charging Stations
- Temecula Park and Ride Two (2) Dual Port Output Electric Vehicle Charging Stations

At this time, we have gathered quotes for the underground electrical work, and concrete flat work for the installation of the two (2) remaining charging stations. We are in the process of preparing purchase orders and processing the appropriate permits through our Building and Safety Department. Work is scheduled to begin in approximately two weeks. It is anticipated that all work will be complete in the month of October, and by or before the end of the calendar year.

Reason for Delay:

We completed the installation of six (6) dual port charging stations within the first six months of the project and intended to install the two (2) remaining stations at our Library location, along with the construction of a new parking facility. Although our original proposal included the installation of two (2) dual port output charging stations at our Ronald H. Roberts Temecula Public Library, during the construction of the new parking facilities, the costs to reconfigure the parking lot and install the required utility infrastructure were significant and would substantially delay the construction timeline. Due to these unforeseen circumstances, we were unable to install the charging stations at this location.

Additionally, due to circumstances beyond our control, the COVID-19 pandemic contributed to our inability to complete the installation of the remaining chargers at an alternate site. With the global impacts and the challenges faced at the local, regional, and state level with COVID-19, we too endured a variety of issues including personnel shortages due to absenteeism, remote working conditions, and the unavailability of contracting services. As with many of our capital projects, this resulted in a delay in project activity.

Although we have encountered some unusual challenges along the way, the City of Temecula is committed to completing the EV Charging Infrastructure project. Therefore, to re-start the project, we have begun new activity to obtain estimates for the installation of the two (2) remaining charging units. Since we cannot install them as planned at the RHR Library, we are expanding the vehicle charging services at our Temecula Park & Ride location. This site can accommodate up to 157 parking spaces, includes a bus pick-up and drop-off, motorcycle parking, and bicycle lockers, and is widely utilized by commuters because of its proximity to Interstate 15. It is also adjacent to Temecula Parkway, the gateway to the Pechanga Casino and

Resort, the Pala Resort & Casino, the Temecula Valley Wine Country, and serves as an alternate route between south Riverside County and North San Diego.

Consequences of Denial:

At this time, we have incurred approximately \$118,000 in our efforts to complete the project. These costs include the purchase of equipment, electrical and site preparation contracting services, and unaccounted administrative staff time. To date, we have not been reimbursed for any portion of the costs incurred.

Our original proposal included a cost estimate of \$188,000, of which 25% is the local match share of \$47,000 and awarded funds of 75% or \$141,000. Based on the balance of work required to install the remaining charging stations, it is anticipated that our overall project costs will be much less, therefore allowing for a possible reduction in the contract value. Overall project costs are estimated at \$145,000, less 25% local match of \$36,250, which could provide for an adjusted contract value of \$108,750, a savings to MSRC of nearly \$32,000.

If denied our request to extend the term of the contract, we will incur the additional costs to install the remaining charging stations and could not fulfill the required operational performance period of three (3) years from the date of station operations.

Because the operational requirement for Level III stations is five years, while the requirement for Level II stations is only three years, the City estimates that they can complete the additional work without a term extension. FINANCIAL IMPACT: \$56,091 is currently scheduled to revert to the AB 2766

Discretionary Fund upon execution of a contract modification by the City. If the MSRC approves the City's request, with the conditions recommended by the MSRC Contracts Administrator,

\$43,591 would revert to the AB 2766 Discretionary Fund.

RECOMMENDATIONS: The MSRC Contracts Administrator recommends that if the MSRC

wishes to approve the increased scope, the MSRC also reduce the

contract value to \$66,409 and approve a four-month term

extension to minimize the potential for additional modifications. The MSRC-TAC reviewed the request and recommends approval of the increased scope, reducing the contract value to \$66,409,

and a four-month term extension.

Contractor: City of Eastvale

Project Title: Install Electric Vehicle Charging Infrastructure

MSRC Funding: \$110,000

Project Term: January 1, 2017 to July 5, 2026

Current Request: Add 4 Level II stations

Previous Requests: Increase stations from 2 limited access and 4 public access to 20 public

access, change locations, and two-year term extension; substitute 12

Level III charging stations for 20 Level II charging stations; increase stations from 12 to 16

<u>Project Description</u>: The City was originally awarded \$110,000 under the MSRC's FYs 2014-16 Local Government Match Program to install 6 Level II electric vehicle charging stations; this was subsequently modified to 20 stations, then to 12 Level III stations and finally to 16 Level III stations. All 16 Level III stations have been completed and \$53,908.85 has been paid to date on this contract.

<u>Previous Requests</u>: As a result of lower than anticipated costs and proposed changes in the proposed locations, the City requested to increase the number of stations to be installed from six (two limited access and four public access) to twenty public access. The City also requested a two-year term extension due to the location changes. At their August 15, 2019 meeting, the MSRC considered and approved the request.

Subsequently, in January 2020, the City indicated that their residents had expressed a strong desire for Level III (fast charge) stations, rather than the Level II stations specified in the contract. Additionally, of the tentative locations identified in the contract, two were developments which had only just broken ground, so that stations could not be installed for at least a year. The Eastvale Gateway Plaza, on the other hand, was an existing Lewis Retail Center. Lewis was ready to install stations now, and desired to install the best possible stations to avoid future costly upgrades. Therefore, the City requested to substitute the installation of twelve Level III charging stations for the twenty Level II stations specified. The City had not yet made a final decision as to what type of Level III stations they would install. At their January 16, 2020 meeting, the MSRC approved the City's request, with the contingency that the MSRC funding could not be used for proprietary charging stations. However, MSRC funding could be used for elements other than the charging equipment itself, such as site work and permitting.

Lastly, in May 2021, the City requested to increase the number of Level III stations from 12 to 16. The MSRC considered and approved the request.

Contract Request: All 16 Level III stations have been installed, and the City's eligible costs reimbursed, leaving a \$56,091 contract value balance. MSRC staff prepared a modification to reduce the contract value so that this balance would revert to the AB 2766 Discretionary Fund, but the City has not executed the modification. Instead, the City indicates that they would like to increase the number of stations to be installed. The City now proposes to install an additional four limited access, Level II charging stations. It is their intention for these stations to become public access at some future date, but they would be considered limited access for purposes of the contract. The City estimates the total cost at \$25,000, and they would provide a 50% match as required under the FYs 2014-16 Local Government Match Program. Thus, this request would use \$12,500 of the remaining MSRC funding. Because the required operational period for Level II stations under the Program is three years, and the City is estimating completion by July 5, 2023, they are not requesting an extension.

<u>Recommendations</u>: The City's request represents a highly unusual scenario. The MSRC has previously approved scope increases for electric vehicle charging infrastructure projects, but only prior to completion of the original scope of work. The City is proposing that they will have

the additional stations operational quickly enough that no extension is needed. However, there's significant concern that the City may be overly optimistic in their projections. Note that if this *had* been an extension request, it would have been denied by the MSRC Contracts Administrator as being for contractor convenience to use the unexpired balance. The MSRC Contracts Administrator recommends that if the MSRC wishes to approve the increased scope, the MSRC also reduce the contract value to \$66,409 (\$53,909 already reimbursed + \$12,500 for additional stations) and approve a four-month term extension to minimize the potential for additional modifications.

The MSRC-TAC reviewed the request and recommends approval of the increased scope, reducing the contract value to \$66,409, and a four-month term extension.

The City of Eastvale (City) would like to request a scope change for Contract #ML16040. The original scope of installing sixteen (16) Level III charging stations has been successfully completed in a timely manner. In seeking to maintain that standard of work, the City of Eastvale would like to request to use the remaining funds to install four (4) additional "Level II" charging stations ("Phase 2") at 13200 Citrus Street.

The term of the current contract terminates on July 5, 2026. The scope of this work proposed as Phase 2 would be completed within the timeline of the contract. The proposed project schedule for completing Phase 2 of the project is shown in the table below. There is no delay in the current project and there will not be a delay within the new scope of work change. If this extension is not offered, there will be no consequences of denial as the City of Eastvale has not entered into any contracts thus far. The City of Eastvale will commit to a 50% match if granted this extension. The charging stations will be utilized for the public and City Fleet.

The estimated project cost for Phase 2 of the project is \$25,000, and this includes materials and labor to complete the proposed work.



The City currently owns three (3) electric vehicles and utilizes two charging stations that were installed with another MSRC grant that the City was awarded under contract number ML18064. To better assist the growing community, the City has a plan to expand its vehicle inventory. Acquiring four (4) "Level II" charging stations will allow the City to get the infrastructure ready for City and staff expansion. Aligning with Eastvale's Strategic Plan, the City strives to be sustainable in operations as to best maintain ecologically sound services. This amendment would benefit both City and South Coast Air Quality Management District/MSRC in adding to success rates of completed agreements and exhausted the intended funds without the need for rollover.

Previously, the City was granted an amendment to its agreement to increase the amount of publicly accessible "Level III" type EV charging stations to be installed at the Eastvale Gateway Plaza. The City completed this amendment without issue and delivered on its commitment to complete this work within budget and schedule.

Please consider this letter as a formal request to amend the contract one final time. The City has been delighted to complete the duties of the contract. Program.

FINANCIAL IMPACT: If the MSRC follows the recommendations of the MSRC Contracts

Administrator, the contract value would be reduced by \$333,610 and that amount would revert to the AB2766 Discretionary Fund.

RECOMMENDATIONS: The MSRC Contracts Administrator recommends a **14-month** term

extension, coupled with a reduced contract scope and value, eliminating the installation of the canopies at both locations and the installation of the additional dispenser at the Lincoln Avenue station, and reducing the total contract value by \$333,610. The remaining scope would be the installation of additional CNG storage spheres for \$50,000. The MSRC-TAC reviewed the request

Note: The MSRC may notice certain similarities between the current request, involving Contract #ML18063 under the MSRC's FYs 2016-18 Local Government Partnership Program, and a request brought forward by the City with respect to Contract #MS16110 in September

2022. Contract #MS16110 effectuated an award to the City for expansion of the Lincoln Avenue and Acorn Street CNG stations under the MSRC's FYs 2014-16 Alternative Fuel Infrastructure Program. These awards involve related, yet different, expansions of the subject CNG stations.

<u>Project Description</u>: The MSRC awarded the City \$383,610 to expand two existing publicly accessible CNG fueling stations. At the Lincoln Avenue location, the project originally called for the addition of a fueling island for Police Department use and a canopy over the compressors. At the Acorn Street location, the project called for the addition of a dual-hose CNG dispenser and a canopy over the dispensers. This was subsequently modified to substitute the installation of an additional dual-hose CNG dispenser for the installation of a separate fueling island for Police Department use at the Lincoln Avenue station, and to substitute the installation of two additional CNG storage spheres for the installation of a dual-hose CNG dispenser at the Acorn Street station. The canopy elements were not changed. No construction has been completed and nothing has been reimbursed to date.

<u>Previous Requests</u>: The City indicated that the installation of a dedicated fueling island for the Police Department would involve the relocation of unleaded gasoline fueling equipment. The expenses associated with this relocation would not be eligible for reimbursement by the MSRC, nor would they qualify as eligible co-funding for the project. The City requested the scope modifications detailed above. In November 2020, the MSRC considered and approved the City's requests.

<u>Contract Request</u>: The City states that the scope changes approved by the MSRC in 2020 delayed the start of work on the project. In particular, the additional dual-hose dispenser could not be installed at the Lincoln Avenue Station until the existing unleaded gasoline equipment is relocated. The City says that a funding source for this work has now been identified.

Furthermore, the City indicates that due to the COVID-19 pandemic, the City experienced major staffing shortages. This has extended the bid process. Also, many people were out sick for long periods, contractors have been taking longer to submit design plans, and it has been taking longer to receive supplies for the projects. There are still many City departments that are understaffed, although they are in the recruitment process. The City estimates that the installation of the additional CNG storage spheres at the Acorn Street Station will be completed by March 2023. Other project elements will follow, with the final piece being the dispenser at the Lincoln Avenue Station in December 2023. Therefore, the City requests a 2-year term extension to allow fulfillment of the required five-year operational period.

Note: at the MSRC-TAC meeting, the City brought forward new information that the installation of the additional dispenser at the Lincoln Avenue station may be accomplished earlier than they previously estimated. The City now estimates that this may be completed by September 2023, rather than December 2023. This would reduce the length of extension needed to 21 months.

<u>Recommendations</u>: The addition of the storage spheres at the Acorn Street station is the project element which is closest to completion according to the City's provided project schedule. The City now estimates the total cost of this element as \$100,000. A 14-month contract term extension would suffice to allow the City to fulfill its five-year operational

requirements for the storage spheres. Expanding storage capacity is a substantial enhancement to the capacity of a CNG station.

The installation of canopies, in comparison, while certainly beneficial, has historically been treated in MSRC programs as a supplemental feature. They are eligible for funding, but only in concert with more significant elements. Finally, the installation of the additional dispenser at the Lincoln Avenue station has the longest time for completion. It also appears likely that staffing issues would continue to impact progress. Therefore, given the MSRC's direction to minimize extensions when there has been minimal progress, the MSRC Contracts Administrator recommends approval of a **14-month** term extension, coupled with a reduced contract scope and value, eliminating the installation of both canopies and the additional dispenser at the Lincoln Avenue station, and reducing the total contract value by \$333,610. The remaining scope would be the installation of additional CNG storage spheres at Acorn Street for \$50,000.

The MSRC-TAC reviewed the request and concurs with the MSRC Contracts Administrator's recommendation for a 14-month term extension with reduced scope and value as described above.

The City of Riverside's Alternative Fuel Program has been extremely successful in providing clean fuels, public access and convenient City consumption of Compressed Natural Gas (CNG), propane, hydrogen, and electric vehicle charging infrastructure.

The City of Riverside (City) Fleet Management Division was awarded ML18063 on June 7, 2019. On September 29, 2020, the City submitted a request for revisions to the scope of work and on February 18, 2021, these modifications were fully approved.

The City would like to formally request a 24 month extension as noted below:

Proposed Project Extension Schedule:

- 1. Extension of the CNG station expansion located at 8095 Lincoln Ave. in-service date from 1/6/22 to 1/6/24 in order to meet the 5-year operational requirement.
- 2. Extension of the CNG station expansion located at 5951 Acorn St. in-service date from 1/6/22 to 1/6/24 in order to meet the 5-year operational requirement.

Justifications:

The proposed project extension for the Lincoln and Acorn Station Expansions is due to many contributing factors. Contract ML18063 was fully executed on June 7, 2019, and the initial scope of work included the following projects:

- Install compressor canopy at the Lincoln Station
- Install Police Department fueling island at the Lincoln Station
- Install additional CNG dispenser at the Acorn Station
- Install dispenser canopy at the Acorn Station

Due to the congestion at the Lincoln CNG/H2/LPG fuel island, Riverside Fleet proposed the relocation of a portion of the existing unleaded fueling equipment at this location and transfer it to the adjacent (offsite) Police Department. This would free up space to install an additional CNG dispenser and reduce congestion. The grant administrator informed Riverside Fleet that none of the costs of relocating the unleaded fueling equipment would be eligible for reimbursement or as match funding therefore Fleet needed to modify the initial scope of work.

After much discussion, the modification to the scope of work included the following projects:

- Install compressor canopy at the Lincoln Station
- Install one (1) dual hose CNG dispenser at the Lincoln Station
- Install two (2) CNG spheres at the Acorn Station
- Install dispenser canopy at the Acorn Station

On February 18, 2021, the modification to the scope of work was fully approved however, this contributed to the delay in the start of the projects. In particular, the existing unleaded equipment will need to be relocated to the Police Department before the dual hose CNG dispenser can be installed at the Lincoln Station. The Fleet Department has finally identified a funding source for the relocation of the unleaded fueling equipment and the bid documents are currently being drafted.

As a result of the Covid-19 Pandemic, the City of Riverside has experienced major staffing shortages causing a major delay in completion of City projects. The BIDs/RFPs were not reviewed as quickly by Purchasing, the Plans took a lot longer to be reviewed and approved, many people were out sick for long periods of time, contractors were also taking longer submitting design plans, and it took longer to receive supplies for the projects. The original Grant Coordinator left the City and the Deputy Director stepped in to manage this grant until a new person was hired. This also was delayed due to COVID-19 and the lack of staffing in Human Resources. The new staff member started in October of 2020. The Fleet Operations Manager left the City of Riverside in April of 2022, and the

position was just recently filled. Currently, there are still many City departments that are understaffed however, they are in the recruitment process.

If this extension is not approved, the city will not be able to fully complete the previously approved scope of work, and the public will not receive the full benefit of this project. The City of Riverside Fleet Management Division was recently recognized by the National Association of Fleet Administers (NAFA) and the No. 1 Green Fleet in North America and the expansion of the alternative fueling stations was one of the contributing factors.

<u>Project Description</u>: The City was awarded \$25,000 under the MSRC's FYs 2016-18 Local Government Partnership Program (LGPP) towards the purchase of one heavy-duty near-zero emission vehicle. The vehicle has been ordered and nothing has been paid to date on this contract.

<u>Previous Requests</u>: The City's initial vehicle purchase was disqualified for failure to meet the emission standards specified in the contract. The City requested a one-year contract term extension to allow time for them to procure a second vehicle which would fulfill the contract requirements. This modification was processed administratively.

Subsequently, the City indicated that they needed longer than anticipated to compile comparisons between bus models, ensuring compliance with the emission requirements set forth in the contract as well as considering efficiency, capacity and lifespan. The City also

evaluated the availability of various procurement approaches, including cooperative purchasing agreements, within their municipal code. The City now expected to bring the selected vehicle to their Council for approval in January 2022 and proceed with the purchase. The City requested a one-year term extension to complete the project. The MSRC approved the request in December 2021.

<u>Contract Request</u>: The City states that in accordance with the schedule they had outlined to the MSRC, they placed their order in January 2022. However, the vendor A-Z Bus Sales has indicated that all bus models with the Ford chassis are delayed in production. The revised inservice date is now estimated at April 2023. The City requests a one-year term extension. They are bound by their purchase order contract, and if the MSRC were to deny the City's request, the City would have to make up the difference.

<u>Recommendations</u>: The MSRC-TAC reviewed the request and recommends approval, contingent on this being the final extension. The MSRC Contracts Administrator recommends approval, contingent on this being the final extension.

Dear Ms. Ravenstein:

The City of La Puente formally requests an extension of MSRC Contract **ML 18178** for a period of twelve (12) additional months from the current in-service date of November 30, 2022. This would extend the five-year contract term for an additional period from Dec. 01, 2027, through Nov. 30, 2028.

The purpose of this request is to allow sufficient time for the clean-air vehicle to be placed into service. On January 18, 2022, the City placed an order with A-Z Bus Sales, Inc. for this vehicle. As of late October of 2022, the vendor still estimates a six (6) to seven (7) month timeframe remaining prior to delivery of the vehicle – placing the revised in-service date on or about April 2023.

This setback reflects significant disruptions in global supply chains, especially with regard to vehicles. A-Z Bus Sales has indicated that Ford chassis for all bus models are delayed in production. This assertion is consistent with the City's experience in procuring other vehicles this year, with longer lead times becoming a frequent occurrence.

Since the City placed its order for the clean-air bus early in 2022, we have secured a relatively favorable place in the chronological order of manufacturing. If the extension request were not approved, the City would still be bound to the purchase order contract and would be required to subsidize the shortfall of grant funds. We have completed 5 out of 6 tasks identified in fulfillment of this contract, and we are hopeful you will consider this in your evaluation.

This letter serves as the City of Monterey Park's formal request for a 32-month extension to MSRC Contract #ML18093 for the purchase of a Heavy-Duty Near-Zero Emission vehicle. This would extend the City's current contract term end date of February 28, 2026 to October 31, 2028. The City's request for an extension would allow the City to complete the procurement process and have the vehicle in service for a minimum of 5 years as required by the contract. According to the current project schedule, the City had to complete the procurement of a CNG Bus for its Spirit Bus fixed-route transit program by December 2020. However, due to the Covid19 pandemic, the City's Spirit Bus was suspended from April 2020 through July 2022. During this time, there were no buses in operation and the anticipated purchase of a CNG Bus to service an additional bus route was not completed. Additionally, during this time, the City experienced significant personnel changes to the management of this grant and was therefore not able to complete or repurpose the MSRC grant funds prior to this year.

At this time, the City is conducting a full evaluation of its fixed-route transit and does not plan to add an additional bus route in the near future. For this reason, it was determined to repurpose the MSRC grant funds for the purchase of an alternate Heavy-Duty Near-Zero emission vehicle for the City. On November 2, 2022, City Council approved a modification request to its MSRC agreement and purchase of a CNG Asphalt Truck with grant funds. A copy of the report for Item 3E and its related approval is enclosed with this letter. Official minutes for this meeting will be forwarded to MSRC once they are made available by the City Clerk's office.

The total cost of the proposed CNG Asphalt Truck is approximately \$327,405. If this modification request is granted, the City would use \$25,000 from its MSRC grant and \$302,405 from its AQMD 2766 Subvention Fund to purchase the vehicle. The City anticipates the vehicle to be in-service by September 2023. An updated project schedule is listed in the following table.

<u>Project Description</u>: The City was awarded \$380,000 under the MSRC's FYs 2014-16 Local Government Match Program to implement a "Complete Streets" project along County Line Road, including the installation of Class II bicycle lanes and sidewalks. No construction has been completed and nothing has been reimbursed to date.

<u>Previous Requests</u>: The City indicated that the specified work was part of a larger project in partnership with the City of Calimesa, and execution of an agreement with Calimesa had taken

longer than expected. The City requested a one-year contract term extension. This modification was processed administratively. In November 2019, the City indicated that the coordination of environmental clearance requirements and right-of-way acquisition with their partner agencies was taking even longer than previously anticipated. The City requested, and the MSRC approved, a one-year term extension. In November 2020, the City indicated that the need for coordination of review with a larger multi-agency project further delayed progress on project design and engineering. The City now expected to advertise for construction bids in June 2021. They requested, and the MSRC approved, a one-year contract term extension.

<u>Contract Request</u>: The City indicates that delays due to staffing and COVID restrictions greatly increased the time necessary for review and processing of the environmental documents. The CEQA documentation was eventually finalized in August 2022. The City currently estimates that the project will be ready to advertise for construction in December 2022, construction expected to complete in July 2023. In order to allow sufficient time for completion of construction, they request a one-year term extension.

MSRC Contracts Administrator Review & Contractor Request for MSRC Review of Denial:In accordance with the MSRC's recently adopted Policy on Contract Modifications, the request was reviewed by the MSRC's Contracts Administrator. The first review is for completeness. Having satisfied those requirements, the request is then checked against a set list of preestablished criteria for denial. The Contracts Administrator denied the City's request because it fell into the following category: the contract had previously been extended for a total of one year or more, no ground has been broken on the project, and the City has not provided evidence of any noncancellable contracts or other financial obligations.

Also as established by the Policy on Contract Modifications, the Contractor has the right to request MSRC review if their extension request is denied by the Contracts Administrator. The City has exercised this option.

<u>Recommendations</u>: The MSRC-TAC reviewed the request and recommends approval, contingent upon award of a construction contract by January 31, 2023.

The purpose of this letter is to respectfully request an extension of time to deliver the subject City of Yucaipa MSRC funded project. Per your email dated August 23, 2022, the expiration date for the subject contract is January 26, 2023. The City of Yucaipa is requesting that this expiration date be extended for an additional twelve (12) months to January 26, 2024. The subject project is a component of a larger multi-agency project which covers roadway improvements along County Line Road.

The larger project includes environmental clearance requirements, right-of-way acquisition and since this is a joint project with the City of Calimesa in Riverside County, coordination with the neighboring agencies. With these additional factors, more time than anticipated has been required to coordinate the design, review, and right-of-way acquisition of the portion of County Line Road improvements covered by contract ML16057. The subject project includes the construction of new asphalt pavement, curb gutter improvements, Class II bicycle lane striping and pavement markings, etc. to accommodate the overall project.

The initial timeline included an anticipated completion of design by early 2019. Staffing shortages, telecommuting and enhanced document processing due to COVID restrictions greatly increased the time it took for plan reviews and resubmittals to be completed by City of Yucaipa, City of Calimesa, Utility Agencies, and Consultant staff. Design for the project was finalized and approved by the City in early 2021. Upon completion of the design staff moved into the environmental phase of the project. Again, delays due to staffing and COVID restrictions greatly increased the review and processing of the environmental documents. As noted in the timeline below, CEQA documentation was finalized in August of this year.

With staff levels returning to normal and completion of the design and bid documents, the City does not anticipate any further delays due to staffing and review times for finalizing right-of-way acquisition and proceeding to the construction phase. The only potential delays the City anticipates would be from weather/rain delays, and reduced working days due to City holidays between now and the 1st of the year. However, these anticipated delays have been reflected in the proposed schedule provided below:

In response to your letter dated October 5, 2022 regarding the City of Yucaipa's request for an extension to Contract #ML16057, the City would like to respectfully appeal the denial of our request. It is our understanding that there are three criteria that need to be considered when it comes to an extension request. We are in agreement with the findings of MSRC in that the contract has already had extensions totaling greater than or equal to one year, however, as our original extension request stated, the COVID-19 pandemic caused a significant delay in the City's ability to coordinate and process the design, environmental, and right-of-way documentation due to office closures and staff shortages.

The second criterion that needs to be considered would be groundbreaking on the project. The City would like to provide additional information regarding construction. The City of Yucaipa's MSRC project is a portion of a larger roadway improvement project of County Line Road from Calimesa Boulevard to Bryant Street (County Line Road Corridor Project). This larger project is phased into three separate sub-projects, each funded by separate state and/or federal grant programs. Phase I, which includes pedestrian and bicycle improvements along County Line Road from 3rd Street to California Street was partially funded by Active Transportation Program (ATP) grant funding. Construction for Phase I was completed in April, 2019. Phase II, which includes construction of roundabouts and associated roadway improvements at County Line Road and Bryant Street, 2nd Street, 3rd Street and 5th Street is partially funded by Local Partnership Program (LPP) grant funding. Construction for phase II of the County Line Road Corridor Project started in March 2022 and has an estimated construction completion date of July 2023. Phase III, the final phase of the County Line Road Corridor Project, which includes pedestrian and bicycle improvements along County Line Road from Calimesa Boulevard to 4th Street (not including the roundabout at 5th Street) is funded by MSRC grant funding and is the subject of this request. While construction of the MSRC funded phase has yet to be started, you can see from the status update previously mentioned that the City has made significant progress to deliver and construct the overall County Line Corridor Project.

An additional factor to consider is the utility coordination and relocation efforts required for the County Line Road Corridor Project. South Mesa Water Company has a proposed watermain replacement project along County Line Road (not funded nor associated with the County Line Road Corridor Project) which requires coordination for timing the waterline improvements to occur prior to the final paving associated with the County Line Road Corridor Project. South Mesa planned their improvements to begin at the east end of the project, with the final improvements to be completed at the west end, where the MSRC funded project is planned. The coordination with South Mesa set the phasing schedule, which resulted in the MSRC portion of the County Line Road Corridor Project scheduled to be completed last.

Finally, the third criterion that needs to be considered to justify granting an extension would be evidence of a financial obligation or contract by the City for the proposed project. County Line Road is located on the boundary between City of Yucaipa and City of Calimesa (as well as San Bernardino County and Riverside County). Due to the multi-jurisdictional responsibility for maintaining/improving County Line Road, the City of Yucaipa entered into a fair share agreement with the City of Calimesa for costs associated with the County Line Road Corridor Improvement Project. This fair share agreement delineates the amount of funding that each City is responsible for contributing to the overall project. The fair share agreement also reflects any grant funding that has been allocated to each phase of the project. The agreement designates the City of Yucaipa as the lead agency for Phase I and Phase III of the project. The agreement states the City of Yucaipa agrees to oversee and complete the project improvements for phase I and phase III, and the agreement limits the amount of funding the City of Calimesa is required to contribute. If the City of Yucaipa were to lose the MSRC funding, we would still be required to construct phase III of the project per the fair share agreement. To date, the City of Yucaipa has expended approximately \$235,00 for design contracts, property appraisals and right-of-way acquisition. The design consultant prepared an engineer's estimate for the construction of the MSRC funded project in the amount of \$560,000 (this is in 2020/2021 dollars).

The City of Yucaipa greatly appreciates the patience that MSRC has provided us thus far for Contract #ML16057. We hope that this letter provides the evidence needed to prove that we are making progress towards construction of the Phase III, MSRC funded improvements, and that you now understand the financial implications if the City's appeal were denied. We look forward to hearing your response after reviewing this matter.

<u>Project Description</u>: The City was awarded \$94,624 under the MSRC's FYs 2016-18 Local Government Partnership Program to procure one medium-duty zero emission vehicle and install a Level III publicly accessible EV charging station. No work has been completed and nothing has been reimbursed to date.

<u>Contract Request</u>: The City indicates that lack of funding for the senior and youth programs which would use the new vehicle delayed progress on the project, but this has now been

resolved. The City currently estimates that City Council approval for the vehicle purchase will be obtained on November 29, and they should be able to take delivery the fourth quarter 2023. Concurrently, they expect to work on the station installation. The City requests a four-year term extension to allow time to fulfill the five-year operational requirement.

MSRC Contracts Administrator Review & Contractor Request for MSRC Review of Denial:In accordance with the MSRC's recently adopted Policy on Contract Modifications, the request was reviewed by the MSRC's Contracts Administrator. Thank you for taking the time to meet with Bryant Hill and myself on September 28, 2022, to discuss MSRC contract # ML18058. We understand that the City of Perris is in breach of the contract and would like to take this opportunity to cure the breach and ask for an extension of time to complete the contract.

The City of Perris is requesting a four (4) year extension to complete the project, which will include one level III/fast charge type electric vehicle station at our city hall location. The project will also include purchasing one (1) medium-duty on-road zero-emission vehicle with a gross weight greater than 8,500 pounds. The City of Perris is committed to utilizing the charging station and zero emissions vehicle for a minimum of five (5) as required by the grant.

The new project schedule will consist of council approval of the vehicle purchase at the November 29, 2022, city council meeting. Once the council approves the vehicle, staff will order the vehicle in December of 2022 and plan on receiving the vehicle as soon as possible, but most likely in the fourth quarter of 2023. While waiting for the vehicle, staff can work with a contractor to install the level III charging station. The project will take up to six months to one year to work with the contractor and electrical company (Southern California Edison) to install a 3-phase electrical for the charging station.

As of now, no work has been completed towards this project, so there is no update on the status of this project.

The reason for the delay of this project was after the grant was originally approved, the city did not have internal funds allocated to the senior and youth programs to use the new electric vehicle. The city has since resolved this issue and created funds for these programs and will be able to execute the grant to its fullest and utilize the new electric vehicle.

At this point in time, no expenses have occurred and since no contracts are in place, there should not be any consequences if the extension is not approved.



Project Title: Construct New CNG Stations in Canyon County and La Puente

MSRC Funding: \$492,000

Project Term: October 2, 2015 to December 1, 2025

Current Request: 32-month term extension

Previous Requests: Reduce time-fill hoses in Canyon Country and reduce value \$8,000; 18-

month term extension; Substitute installations in Canyon Country and La

Puente for Downey and 13-month term extension

<u>Project Description</u>: The County was originally awarded \$500,000 under the MSRC's FYs 2012-14 Local Government Match Program to install a CNG station in Downey, but this was subsequently changed to the installation of stations in Canyon Country and La Puente. Later, the number of time-fill hoses to be installed was reduced, with a corresponding reduction in contract value. Designs have been completed for both stations and permits have been issued

for the Canyon Country station, but no construction has been performed; nothing has been reimbursed to date.

The County indicated that with the opening of Southern California Gas' Previous Requests: CNG station in Pico Rivera, their need for a station in Downey was diminished. However, the County determined that stations in two other locations--Canyon Country and La Puente—would serve a greater percentage of their Public Works fleet. The County requested to substitute these station locations for the station in Downey. The location changes delayed the project, so the County also requested a 13-month contract term extension. At their August 18, 2016 meeting, the MSRC considered and approved the County's request. In early 2020, the County indicated that they had encountered equipment order and construction delays associated with their vendor. The County requested, and the MSRC approved, an 18-month contract term extension. In late 2020, the County indicated that the area designated for the installation of time fill hoses at the Canyon Country location was highly congested. The limited space needs to accommodate parking, staging, and storage for trucks, equipment and material. The County requested to reduce the number of time fill hoses to be installed from six to four, with a corresponding \$8,000 reduction in the contract value. The MSRC considered and approved this request.

<u>Contract Request</u>: The County now indicates that equipment delivery delays experienced during the COVID-19 pandemic, as well as longer than anticipated time getting plans approved by Building and Safety and permits issued by Regional Planning, have further delayed the project. The County requests a 32-month term extension to allow time to complete the installations and fulfill the five-year operational requirement.

<u>Project Description</u>: The City was originally awarded \$50,000 under the MSRC's FYs 2016-18 Local Government Partnership Program to procure one light-duty zero emission vehicle and install 8 Level II limited-access EV charging stations. Subsequently, the City decided not to proceed with the vehicle procurement, and Contract #ML18132 was executed for \$40,000 for the EV charging infrastructure only. No work has been completed and nothing has been reimbursed to date.

<u>Contract Request</u>: The City indicates that subsequent to the submittal of their funding application, they discovered that the existing electrical panel at the Civic Center would not support the stations. The City has since completed a variety of infrastructure improvements, at

a cost of approximately \$9,000, in anticipation of the charging station installation. With these improvements completed, the City entered into an agreement for design of the charging station installation project; with approximately \$11,000 expended to date, the design has taken much longer than anticipated. The City requests a three-year term extension to allow time to complete the installations and fulfill the three-year operational requirement.

We respectfully request that AQMD approve a request for a time extension for this project.

Project Status - project is currently in the final plan check phase for construction documents. The estimated time for advertisement and construction is approximately six months.

Reason for project delay - Following the approval of the AB 2766/MSRC grant application, City staff discovered that the existing electrical panel at the Civic Center building site was not adequate in size to allow for the installation of a new Electrical Vehicle (EV) Charging Station. After having a conference call with Cynthia Ravenstein, MSRC Contracts Administrator, we received a denial letter. We respectfully request that MSRC members reconsider this decision and approve a request for a time extension for this project based on the following information.

Project Status – project is complete and ready to advertise within a 30 day notice. The estimated time for advertisement and construction is approximately six months.

SYNOPSIS: Geographics currently hosts and maintains the

www.CleanTransportationFunding.org website under Contract #MS21006. This contract includes an option for a two-year contract term extension. MSRC staff recently reviewed Geographic's performance, and found that Geographics was

performing well in hosting and maintaining the site.

RECOMMENDATIONS: MSRC staff recommends that the MSRC execute the two-year

option for Contract #MS21006, increasing the contract amount by

\$7,200. The MSRC-TAC reviewed the recommendation and

recommends approval.

FISCAL IMPACT: Sufficient funding for this contract value increase is available in

the AB 2766 Discretionary Fund and will be included in the

FYs 2021-24 Work Program.

Discussion:

Following an open RFP process, the MSRC entered into its current contract with Geographics for hosting and maintenance of the MSRC website effective June 21, 2021. The contract allowed for a two-year extension, contingent upon allocation of funds by the MSRC and approval by the South Coast AQMD Governing Board.

MSRC staff reviewed Geographics' performance over the term of the contract with an eye towards consideration of the option. Geographics has been quick to respond to any problems identified by MSRC staff. Geographics has fulfilled one Task Order during this period, to implement Design Updates. This included correcting a Twitter link on the home page and other design changes as directed by MSRC staff.

The MSRC staff consensus is that Geographics is performing well in hosting and maintaining the site. Based on its evaluation process, MSRC staff finds that Geographics has met all responsibilities identified in their contract. Currently, the contract has a value of \$12,952 with a remaining balance of approximately \$7,000, most of which is allocated for Miscellaneous Costs (software licenses, domain registrations, browser upgrades, software upgrades, and debugging of new file formats) and Website Revisions.

<u>Recommendations</u>: MSRC staff recommends that Geographic's contract option be exercised, increasing the contract amount by \$7,200 for a new total contract amount of \$20,152. The MSRC-TAC reviewed this recommendation and recommends approval. Sufficient funding for this contract is available in the AB 2766 Discretionary Fund and will be included in the FYs 2021-24 Work Program.

<u>Next Steps</u>: If approved by the MSRC, the SCAQMD Governing Board will consider the allocation of \$7,200 for two years' continued hosting and maintenance of the MSRC website at their January 6, 2023 meeting.

SECTION 1 - INTRODUCTION

For over 30 years, the Mobile Source Air Pollution Reduction Review Committee (MSRC) has sought to deploy cutting-edge transportation demand management (TDM) and "smart mobility" programs that expand the boundaries of how we live, work, and play in the South Coast AQMD region – striving for faster, cheaper, and *greener* transportation solutions. As an investor in clean mobility, collaboration with expert project partners is essential to achieve the MSRC's objective of improving air quality by reducing motor vehicle pollution in the South Coast AQMD region.

The MSRC has identified **Microtransit** as a mobility strategy that closely aligns with MSRC objectives. For the purpose of this Request for Proposals, microtransit is defined broadly as technology-enabled, shared transportation, that fills the void between traditional "fixed route" transit and "ride hailing" technology.

This. As discussed in subsequent sections of this RFP, the MSRC places a high level of emphasis on deploying microtransit in areas that will most directly benefit from this mobility solution. These include, but are not limited to:

- Areas where Microtransit can be directly integrated into other transit systems enhancing transit in areas where deploying traditional fixed-route service would prove challenging;
- High-density urban or suburban communities where deployment of traditional fixed-route transit does not meet the mobility needs of the residents, including areas in proximity to activity centers that attract patrons from other areas;
- Disadvantaged Communities (DAC) or other regions that lack adequate transportation and mobility options;
- Areas that suffer disproportionately from air pollution.

Additionally, the MSRC seeks to invest in Microtransit service with the following features:

- ⇒ The applicant proposes a **New** microtransit mobility solution within a specified geographic area, or the **Expansion** of an existing microtransit service(s) targeting new service area(s), new riders, and additional reductions in automobile vehicle miles traveled (VMT);
- ⇒ The MSRC funding serves as **Seed Money** an initial investment to launch or expand innovative microtransit mobility solutions;
- ⇒ The applicant presents a strong **Business Case** for the new or expanded microtransit service, including a service continuation plan that thoroughly explains how the proposed microtransit service will be sustainable beyond the MSRC funding period.

The following Sections describe the eligibility requirements to participate in the MSRC Microtransit Services Program, and guidelines for proposal preparation. It is important to recognize that the MSRC must ensure that the use of Clean Transportation funds will result in direct, tangible, and quantifiable

<u>air quality benefits</u>. To this end, this RFP stipulates specific performance thresholds and participation obligations that must be met in order to be deemed eligible for an MSRC funding award.

MSRC staff members are available to answer questions and provide technical and programmatic guidance as appropriate. Please refer to Section 6 of this document for a list of MSRC Staff contacts.

SECTION 2 – RFP OVERVIEW & ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS

2.1 - Available Funding - The total amount of MSRC Clean Transportation Funding™ allocated for the Microtransit Services Program is \$2.5M. This funding level is a targeted amount – should meritorious projects be received totaling greater than \$2.5M, the MSRC reserves the right to increase the amount of total funding available.

Also, should the MSRC receive proposals with total requests less than the amount allocated, or if proposals are deemed non-meritorious, the MSRC reserves the right to reduce the total funding available and reallocate funds to other Work Program categories. The MSRC also reserves the right to not fund any of the proposals received, irrespective of the merits of the proposals submitted.

Please note that the source of MSRC Clean Transportation Funding[™] for projects submitted in response to this RFP is motor vehicle registration fees collected by the California Department of Motor Vehicles (DMV) in accordance with the California Health and Safety Code. Thus, the availability of MSRC Clean Transportation Funding[™] is contingent upon the timely receipt of funds from the DMV. Neither the MSRC nor South Coast AQMD can guarantee the collection or remittance of registration fees by the DMV.

- 2.2 Geographical Funding Minimum The MSRC has established a Geographical Funding Minimum for each county within the SCAQMD. The geographical funding minimum amount has been set at \$312,500 per county. This funding set-aside guarantees a minimum level of funding for each county to implement microtransit service. Following the completion of proposal evaluation, scoring, and ranking, if any county has funds remaining in its geographical funding minimum, these funds will be made available to qualifying projects from any other county in rank order of project score.
- 2.3 Eligibility Requirements For the purpose of this RFP, the following eligibility requirements apply:
 - Eligible Microtransit Service Providers includes but is not necessarily limited to a) public transit agencies, including regional and municipal transit agencies and authorities; b) private transportation operators, including subcontractor service providers to public transit agencies; and c) paratransit providers and other licensed, private transportation and shuttle service providers;
 - Qualifying Microtransit Vehicles all microtransit vehicles must meet the following requirements:

- ✓ All vehicles must be California Air Resources Board certified zero-emission vehicles (i.e., no tailpipe emissions);
- ✓ There is flexibility as it pertains to vehicle range and size; however eligible vehicles must accommodate a minimum of four (4) seated passengers in addition to the driver. Eligible vehicles can include neighborhood electric vehicles, low-speed vehicles, vans, shuttles, etc.;
- ✓ Vehicles must meet all Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA), US Department of Transportation (DOT), California Department of Motor Vehicles (DMV), and other applicable regulatory agency standards.
- Eligible Uses of MSRC Funds MSRC funds may be used to offset Direct Operating Costs associated with new or expanded microtransit service, as follows:
 - ✓ Transportation Operations Direct costs associated with operations of microtransit services;
 - ✓ Marketing, outreach, and promotion of the availability of the microtransit service;
 - ✓ Reasonable administrative costs. The determination of what constitutes "reasonable" costs is within the sole discretion of the MSRC.
- Ineligible Uses of MSRC Funds MSRC funds cannot be used to pay for the following project elements. Costs associated with these project elements are required to be co-funded by the microtransit project applicant:
 - ✓ Capital costs associated with microtransit vehicle purchase or lease;
 - ✓ Acquisition of real property;
 - ✓ Costs associated with electric vehicle charging infrastructure (EVSE) purchase or installation;

SECTION 3 – CONDITIONS & FUNDING CONSTRAINTS

- 3.1 Maximum MSRC-Funded Operations Period the maximum length of time MSRC funding can be used to subsidize new or expanded microtransit service operations is **eighteen (18) months**.
- 3.2 Microtransit Service Outreach, Marketing, and Promotion all microtransit service projects that receive an MSRC Clean Transportation Funding™ award must include advertising and promotion of the availability of the service as a project element.

3.3 – Project Co-Funding Requirements – microtransit service projects funded by the MSRC are required to provide minimum project co-funding. Co-funding must be greater than or equal to **50% of the total project cost**, i.e., a maximum of 50% of total project costs to be co-funded by the MSRC.

Eligible project co-funding includes the following:

- Direct Cost Share Cash, direct labor, and microtransit vehicle, facilities, and support equipment
 use contributions from the transportation provider can be accounted for as co-funding;
- Indirect Cost Share Overhead costs and general and administrative expenses can be accounted for as co-funding;
- Fare Box Revenue Fare box revenue collected to augment MSRC-funded transportation program can be documented and applied as co-funding;
- Microtransit Service Outreach, Marketing, and Promotion Direct costs associated with advertising the availability of microtransit service projects may be applied as co-funding.
- 3.4 MSRC Funds Remitted on a Reimbursement Basis MSRC funds will be distributed on a reimbursement basis only upon completion of approved project milestones and submittal of all required reports and invoices.
- 3.5 Additional Conditions on MSRC Funding the following conditions apply to all MSRC-funded microtransit service projects:
 - MSRC microtransit service projects are funded on a "area-specific" basis; that is, each project is
 evaluated with respect to the proposed service area's location, activity centers, traffic
 congestion, availability of other transportation options, etc. Proposals that result in an award of
 MSRC funds are not allowed to change the microtransit service location under any
 circumstances. In the event the proposed service area becomes unavailable, nonviable, or no
 longer cost-effective, either contract negotiations will terminate, or the contract will terminate,
 as applicable.
 - Certifications All Proposers must complete and submit the included Attachment G forms as an element of their Proposal (unless specifically exempted below):
 - Internal Revenue Service Form W-9 Request for Taxpayer Identification Number and Certification, and Franchise Tax Board Form 590 Withholding Exemption Certificate. If you are selected for an award, you cannot be established as a vendor without this information.
 - Campaign Contributions Disclosure. This information must be provided at the time of application in accordance with California law. You may be asked for an update when awards are considered.
 - Certification Regarding Debarment, Suspension and Other Responsibility Matters The SCAQMD needs this information for their vendor database.

- Disadvantaged Business Certification. The SCAQMD needs this information for their vendor database. <u>It will not be considered in the determination of your MSRC funding award</u>. Governmental entities do not need to complete this form.
- Finally, in accordance with state law, all projects awarded MSRC Clean Transportation Funding™ are subject to audit. The provisions of audits are discussed in the Sample Contract, attached to this RFP.

SECTION 7 - PROPOSAL EVALUATION & SCORING PROCESS

All proposals received prior to the RFP deadline will undergo evaluation, scoring, and ranking by a Subcommittee comprised of members of the MSRC Technical Advisory Committee (MSRC-TAC). Proposals will be evaluated and scored against four (4) evaluation criteria:

- 1. Overall Project Cost-Effectiveness (35 points maximum)
- 2. Project Sustainability and Continuation Plan (35 points maximum)
- 3. Connectivity and integration with other public transit (15 points maximum), and
- 4. The extent to which the proposed project serves Disadvantaged Communities (DAC), areas that lack adequate transportation and mobility options, or are disproportionally impacted by unhealthful air quality (15 points maximum).

The total maximum points available is 100.

- 1. MICROTRANSIT SERVICE COST-EFFECTIVENESS (0 35 Points). Proposals will be evaluated as to their ability to displace automobile trips and VMT and corresponding reductions in reactive organic gases, oxides of nitrogen (NO_x), and particulate matter exhaust pollution. Cost-effectiveness will be computed as the ratio of the MSRC funding request amount to the quantified emission reductions, using the methodology included in the California Air Resources Board publication "Methods to Find the Cost-Effectiveness of Funding Air Quality Projects For Evaluating Motor Vehicle Registration Fee Projects". The maximum score of 35 points will be assigned to the project deemed most cost-effective, with points assigned to all other proposals received on a prorated basis.
- 2. SERVICE CONTINUATION PLAN (0 35 Points). MSRC microtransit service funding is intended as "seed money" for new or expanded service and is not intended to serve as an ongoing funding source for microtransit operations. Proposers are required to discuss how the proposed microtransit service will continue beyond the MSRC funding period, including the sources of internal and external revenue that will be pursued to augment and ultimately replace MSRC funding. Projects that have a definitive plan for continuing the microtransit service well beyond the MSRC funding period will be awarded a higher point allocation.
- 3. CONNECTIVITY TO AND INTEGRATION WITH OTHER PUBLIC TRANSIT SERVICES (0 15 Points). The extent to which the proposed microtransit service is coordinated and integrated with other existing public transportation services, including connectivity with existing regional or municipal bus service, Metrolink, light rail, transit centers, etc. Proposers should clearly outline the proposed microtransit service connectivity with other existing public transit services in their proposal.

4. MOBILITY ENHANCEMENT IN DISADVANTAGED OR UNDERSERVED AREAS (0 – 15 Points). The extent to which the proposed microtransit service project serves disadvantaged Communities (DAC), areas that lack adequate transportation and mobility options, or are disproportionally impacted by unhealthful air quality.

Following scoring, proposals will be ranked based on the numerical score assigned as well as the Geographic Funding requirements discussed above in Section 2.2. The highest ranked proposals will be forwarded to the MSRC for funding consideration.

Up Partnership with South Coast AQMD

SYNOPSIS: As an element of their FYs 2018-21 Work Program, the MSRC

partnered with the South Coast AQMD for a VIP Plus Up Incentive. The baseline VIP offers incentives to encourage the replacement of older, higher-polluting vehicles with newer, lower-emission vehicles. The Plus Up offers an increased incentive to achieve additional surplus emission reductions. The MSRC subsequently extended the date for application acceptance under the Plus Up partnership to August 31, 2022, as well as extending the deadline for delivery of the replacement vehicle to December 31, 2023. South Coast AQMD has completed their evaluation of applications received by the August 31, 2022 deadline. A total of 12 projects were approved for Plus Up incentives. 6 projects have already

been completed and reimbursed.

RECOMMENDATION: A total of \$590,000 has been reimbursed to date. For the 6

projects which have been approved, but not yet completed, a total of \$655,000 in Plus Up funding would continue to be reserved through March 31, 2024. MSRC staff recommend that the remaining \$1,255,000 allocated for this program revert to the AB 2766 Discretionary Fund for redeployment. The MSRC-TAC considered this recommendation and recommend approval.

FINANCIAL IMPACT: If the MSRC approves the recommended action, \$655,000 to

cover approved applications would continue to be reserved through March 31, 2024. \$1,255,000 would revert to the AB 2766

Discretionary Fund.

<u>Background</u>: In April 2020, the MSRC allocated \$5,000,000 to partner with the South Coast AQMD and provide a Plus Up Incentive on their VIP Program, with a sunset date of December 31, 2021. Using funds provided by CARB, South Coast AQMD implements the VIP to encourage the replacement of older, higher-polluting vehicles with newer, lower-emission vehicles which

meet the $0.20~g/bhp-hr~NO_x$ standard. The program features a rapid response time and is limited to small fleets of 10 or fewer vehicles. With the Plus Up incentive, for those fleets willing to pursue the cleanest commercially available technologies certified at 0.02~g/bhp-hr~NOx or cleaner—generally alternative fuel at this time—MSRC funds are added to the amount of the voucher.

In April 2021, the MSRC approved midcourse adjustments to the VIP Plus Up. Given slow uptake during the 2020 round, the MSRC authorized an increase in the maximum combined incentive for Class 8 trucks from \$100,000 to \$125,000. The MSRC also authorized reallocating \$2,500,000 to address other immediate MSRC funding needs.

In November 2021, the MSRC:

- Recognized replacement of VIP funding with an allocation from the Clean Fuels Fund;
- Extended the date for application acceptance under the Plus Up partnership with South Coast AQMD to August 31, 2022; and
- Extended the deadline for delivery of the replacement vehicle to December 31, 2023.

Any funding not applied for by August 31, 2022 would revert to the AB 2766 Discretionary Fund. Allowing a 90-day period for payment processing following vehicle delivery, funds to cover approved applications would continue to be reserved through March 31, 2024. There was no change in the MSRC's funding contributions on a per-vehicle level.

<u>Current Status</u>: South Coast AQMD has completed their evaluation of applications received by the August 31, 2022 deadline. Since inception of the partnership, a total of 12 projects were approved for Plus Up incentives. 6 projects have already been completed and reimbursed a total of \$590,000. The 6 additional applications approved will require a total of \$655,000 in Plus Up funding. This \$655,000 would continue to be reserved through March 31, 2024.

SYNOPSIS: In November 2019, the MSRC allocated \$4,000,000 to partner

with South Coast AQMD to implement a Market Acceleration Program to encourage the early deployment of near-zero

emission natural gas trucks. In August 2020, the MSRC reallocated

\$3,000,000 of this funding to a separate South Coast AQMD program, the Trade Up Program. Subsequently, the MSRC approved adjustments to the Program. Due to COVID-19 driven supply chain issues, no truck trade up transactions have been accomplished. South Coast AQMD is now formulating an alternative work scope which promises to be significantly

different than the original.

RECOMMENDATION: MSRC staff recommend that the \$3,000,000 allocated for this

program revert to the AB 2766 Discretionary Fund. The MSRC-TAC

considered this recommendation and recommends approval.

FINANCIAL IMPACTS: If the MSRC approves the recommended action, \$3,000,000

would revert to the AB 2766 Discretionary Fund.

<u>Background</u>: In November 2019, the MSRC allocated \$4,000,000 to partner with South Coast AQMD and Clean Energy to implement a Market Acceleration Program (MAP) to encourage the early deployment of near-zero emission natural gas trucks. The MAP is a vehicle replacement program which targets heavy-duty on-road vehicles used in short-haul drayage activities in the South Coast Air Basin. As envisioned at the time, two types of transactions were described to the MSRC under MAP:

- 1. The first and simplest type was for a fleet to scrap a pre-2010 truck and buy a new near-zero truck with \$100,000 in incentives.
- 2. The second type of transaction involved two parties and three trucks:

- Have a fleet trade their 2014 or newer truck (0.2 g NOx) to a small fleet (10 or fewer trucks) for their old truck plus \$10,000*
- The small fleet gets a newer, lower-emitting truck to drive for \$10,000*
- The fleet scraps the old truck and buys a new 0.02g NOx (near-zero) truck with \$105,183 in incentives**

Subsequent to the MSRC's action, South Coast AQMD decided to bifurcate the two aspects of MAP. Clean Energy continued to coordinate the simpler vehicle purchase incentive element, and the MAP name was retained for this aspect. Meanwhile, South Coast AQMD received EPA funds through the Diesel Emissions Reduction Program for the development of a separate trade program to focus on the two-party, three-truck transactions. Gladstein, Neandross, and Associates was enlisted to assist with matching fleets, and truck dealerships were lined up to participate. MSRC funding would only be used towards vehicle incentives. South Coast AQMD requested, and the MSRC approved, to reallocate \$3,000,000 from the MAP to the Trade Up Program (TUP; known at that time as the Trade Down Program).

In October 2021, the MSRC approved the following adjustments to the TUP:

- Small fleet's cost for the 2014 or newer truck reported to the MSRC as \$10,000;
 subsequently changed to \$30,000. No impact to the MSRC incentive amount.
- Total South Coast AQMD/MSRC incentives for near-zero truck reported to the MSRC as \$105,183; subsequently changed to \$100,000. Slight reduction in the MSRC incentive amount per truck.
- Allow deduction of up to \$10,000 in necessary repairs from the \$25,000 trade-in credit for the 2014 or newer truck. No impact on the MSRC incentive amount.
- Allow the collection of a non-refundable deposit on near-zero truck orders as part of TUP. No impact on the MSRC incentive amount.

<u>Current Status</u>: No truck trade transactions have been accomplished to date. This is attributed to COVID-19 driven supply chain issues. South Coast AQMD is now formulating an alternative work scope which promises to be significantly different than the original.

<u>Recommendations</u>: MSRC staff recommend that the \$3,000,000 allocated for this program revert to the AB 2766 Discretionary Fund. The MSRC-TAC considered this recommendation and recommends approval.
